Public Health Lecture Series 1: IDSP and its role in Disease Control and Prevention on 25.07.2019

The Department of Community Medicine conducted 1st lecture as a part of Public health Lecture Series for 7th term students. Dr. Kavitha H S, District Epidemiologist, District Surveillance Unit, Mysuru delivered the talk on “**IDSP and its role in Disease Control and Prevention**”.

She highlighted on the staffing pattern of IDSP, role of district surveillance unit which included compilation, analysis of Weekly S, P and L forms, review of feedback to the reporting units, Constitution of Rapid response Teams and their deputations during Outbreak Investigation, IDSP portal and its features, Co-ordination with laboratories, Medical Colleges, NGO’s and Private sectors; and organising District level meetings under the chairmanship of DC. She also explained on Media alert and how FIR is prepared and how the investigations are taken.



She shared some of the examples like **Gastroenteritis outbreak** investigation in a function at K R Nagar after consuming food around 60 people were sick and the actions taken in management of outbreak was explained. **Case study of KFD (Kysanur Forest Disease)** in a migrant worker from Kerala and its investigation & management was highlighted. The recent **Nipah outbreak management** in Kerala and precautions taken in Mysuru were shared by her. Students expressed that as real and practical examples of management of outbreaks were explained, they felt more involved and learnt a lot from these experiences and preferred to have few more lectures similar to these.

Public Health Lecture Series 3: National Nutrition Week & Nutritional Rehabilitation Centre on 26.09.2019

The second lecture for the series was delivered by **Dr. Rashmi. S**, Medical Officer, NRC (**Nutritional Rehabilitation Centre**), Cheluvamba Hospital, Mysuru. She delivered the talk on “**National Nutrition Week & Nutritional Rehabilitation Centre**”.

Every year **National Nutrition Week** is observed from September 1st - 7th with the objective to review the frequency of various nutritional problems in the communities, to prevent and control this problem through adaptable training, timely education, seminars, and many other campaigns.

Wherein she emphasized about objectives and activities done during National Nutrition week, about **POSHAN Abhiyaan**, (its key theme and pillars) and five components of POSHAN MAAH 2019 which includes 1) Journey of the first 1000 days of a child 2) Anemia mukt Bharat 3) Diarrhoea Prevention 4) Paushtik Aahar and 5) waSH (wash, sanitation and hygiene).

She also enlightened about **NRC** where SAM (severe acute malnutrition) children are admitted and managed, the criteria of SAM, their admission, management and discharge, and history and management of two cases of SAM in NRC were discussed in detail. Dr. Rashmi also explained about starter diet used during stabilization phase which promotes recovery of normal metabolic function and nutrition – electrolyte balance and catch-up diet used during transition phase. The overall session was very informative and interactive.



Public Health Lecture Series 3: Guest lecture on NPCDCS by Dr Archana

A guest lecture was arranged by the Department of Community Medicine under Public Health Guest lecture series on 10/10/2019. He addressed the students on “Suicide Prevention” topic. Wherein he quoted that “every minute one person attempts for suicide somewhere in the world & every other second someone think to commit suicide”.



The session went in a very interactive manner by testing the students knowledge, showing them well known people who committed suicide & the students were given prize for answering the questions. He gave a detailed explanation on the cause, the stress these people go through before taking such a decision, wrong notation among people about suicide & also how to behave with them once their attempt failed, He also emphasized on the increasing rate of suicide among the students & how to overcome it. The overall session was very informative and interactive.

India has complex health problems ranging from infections to malnutrition and in order to overcome that our primary care needs to be strengthened. Medical practitioners lack good communication skills making the doctor-patient relationship more materialistic. Hence it is the important to include competency, skills, communication skills and community oriented training at the undergraduate level itself in order to prepare them for lifelong learning and address the challenges. His talk was followed by an interactive session which included activities for the students and lastly a mental exercise was conducted to help students to set targets and goals.

The topic was chosen as use of artificial intelligence (AI) has been increasing in various sectors of society, particularly the pharmaceutical industry. In particular, drug discovery and development, drug repurposing, improving pharmaceutical productivity, and clinical trials, among others; such use reduces the human workload as well as achieving targets in a short period of time.

Continuing Pharmacotherapy Education (CPhE) (2nd Feb 2019 ; 22nd Feb 2019 & 23rd Feb 2019)

Continuing Pharmacotherapy Education (CPhE) is an opportunity to the Pharm D and M Pharm (Pharmacy Practice) / M Pharm (Pharmacology) students to establish the better understanding of pharmacotherapy and strong clinical base to serve as clinical pharmacist in diverse patient care settings. As pharmacotherapy specialists, pharmacists have responsibility for direct patient care, often functioning as a member of a multidisciplinary team, and acting as the primary source of drug-related information for other healthcare professionals. With this aim, the CPhE program was organized on the topic “Role of Clinical Pharmacists in managing the endocrine disorders” on 02.02.2019 for the benefit of our students.

Dr P Velayutham, Consultant Endocrinologist, Royal Care Specialty Hospitals, Coimbatore delivered the lecture during the program. He defined the role of Clinical Pharmacy and the clinical pharmacists practice areas in a typical hospital set-up. Further, in his presentation he majorly focused on the pituitary gland disorders, thyroid gland disorders and diabetes mellitus. He also added examples of various clinical cases from his experience as endocrinologist.

He classified the endocrine disorders as hypofunction, hyperfunction, resistance to hormones and tumours involving endocrine glands. He discussed about the pituitary gland and its various disorders in detail. Further, he also added the pituitary dysfunction details and its management including the growth hormone, ACTH, and steroid (excess use! And its potency) with clinical examples. A special emphasis was given on pituitary tumours during his presentation. After, a small question and answer session; he started discussing about thyroid gland and its disorders including hypothyroidism and its treatment; thyroid level fluctuating etc. Further, he added his experience in managing the diabetes mellitus patients. He also narrated about the insulin types, dosing, selection etc. A special emphasis was given on the pre-mixed insulin during his presentation. A special note was given by the invited speaker on the role of clinical pharmacists at his practice.



Drug Safety: Pharmacovigilance / Haemovigilance / Vaccine vigilance (9th March 2019)

One Day Workshop on Drug Safety was organized by the Dept. of Pharmacy Practice on 11th March 2019. About 100 participants participated in the program.
