The communication skill program delivered by Arivu Skill Development Academy was evaluated at 07 different factors with maximum of 05 marks per factor. The total average of factor marks scored out of maximum 05 marks was 4.3, which is graded as excellent.

The overall feedback can be summarised as, about 90% of the B. Pharm and Pharm D students expressed that this program helped them to express themselves in a better manner, improved their communication skill with the teachers and senior students and the sessions induced positive thinking in them. About 07% students felt the program duration was short and expressed the duration to be increased. Approximately 03% students expressed the program was less interesting. The students also express their gratitude to facilitator H V Vishvesh for extending equal opportunity to all the students to express themselves and giving his valuable advice wherever necessary.

### **A report on Communication skill development**

While addressing the students, she mentioned that for human being between the age group 12 – 20 years can be considered as adolescent age and also stressed that how they will behave with their parents, when parents interfere in their behavior, dress code etc. She stressed upon the point why parents are more worried about their children’s, even though they are adolescent, educated and doing their Job. She mentioned that how psychologically students are affected by this Pandemic in the academic year 2020-21.





Next talk was Mr.Panchaksharappa Gowda , Asst.professor, Department of Pharmacy Practice, JSS College of Pharmacy, who delivered a lecture on the topic “**Yoga and Health**”. During his talk he stressed upon how to increase the awareness level by moving from lower level chakras to higher level chakra and cleansing of five koshas.

**Annamaya Kosha:** The outer sheath is the body layer: muscles, bones, skin, organs. Anna means food, which is what sustains this level.

**Pranamaya Kosha:** The next sheath is the life force/energy sheath. It is concerned with the breath and the flow of energy throughout the body. The flow of energy can improved by practicing breathing exercises (Pranayama) regularly.

**Manomaya Kosha:** The next sheath is the mind or mental sheath. It includes thoughts and emotions. It is maintained through meditation.

**Vijnanamaya Kosha:** is the knowledge sheath. This kosha is comprised of your wisdom, intuition, and perception. Meditation is also the key to this layer.

**Anandamaya Kosha:** The innermost sheath is the bliss sheath. It represents unending joy, love, peace, and complete happiness.

He stressed about importance of raw food and how one will be energetic, if they raw food and fruits with boiled food. He also emphasized about the breathing exercise (Pranayama) and Physical exercise (Yogasana) to oneself more healthy and active.

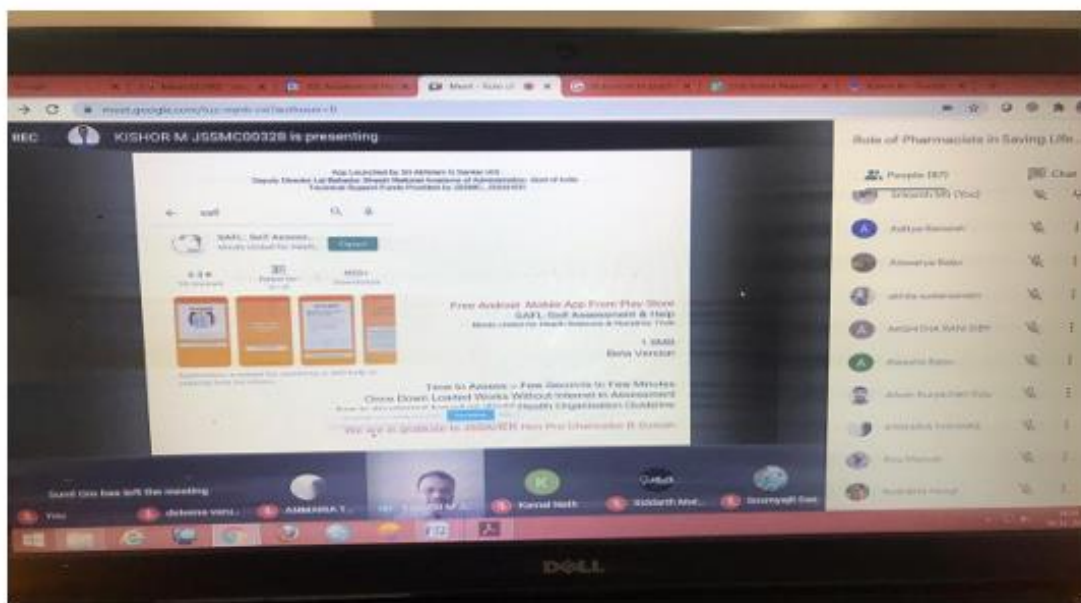


### **Report on Guest Lecture on 'Role of Pharmacists in Life Saving: SAFL App'**

The lecture was organized with the objective to enlighten students about their role, as a member of healthcare team, in saving life of patients. Dr. Kishor, during his lecture, said that life is precious and saving life of the patients is important for every healthcare professional. Also, he explained about how

pharmacists can play an important role in suicide prevention. And he explained about a free android mobile application “SAFL” Self assessment and Help that can be used to check the need for assistance for the individuals who are more prone for suicidal attempts. He discussed about the app in reference to its ease of use, assessment and multiple benefits.

Further, Dr. Kishor gave insights into various roles and responsibilities of pharmacists in the management of patients with psychiatry disorders. Students of fifth & sixth year PharmD and II M. Pharm Pharmacy Practice from both the campus of JSS College Pharmacy, Mysuru & Ooty attended the guest lecture. As it was an interactive session, students actively participated in the discussion. The guest lecture was held using Google meet online platform.



### **Guest Lecture on ‘Career Opportunities for Pharmacy Practice Students’**

Department of Pharmacy Practice in association with Alumni Association, JSS College of Pharmacy, Mysuru organized an e-guest lecture on the topic “Career Opportunities for Pharmacy Practice Students” on 30th January 2021 for the benefit of PharmD and M. Pharm Pharmacy Practice students. Mr. Nidhin Mohan, President - New Island Pharmacy, USA and alumni of JSS College of Pharmacy, Mysuru was the resource person. The lecture was organized with the objective to enlighten students about career opportunities for pharmacy practice professionals in various fields of pharmacy worldwide. Mr. Nidhin discussed on the

various areas of practice of pharmacy professionals across the globe and highlighted the current scenario in United States. Also, he briefed on the top areas of practice of pharmacy and then he focused his talk on typical activities of community pharmacist ranging from processing of prescriptions to medication therapy monitoring.

Later, he explained the concept of medication therapy monitoring and its importance in a community pharmacy setting. During his lecture, he explained its process, different component of medication therapy monitoring such as adherence checking, refills needed, new therapy needed, identifying barriers, interactions, analyzing proper usage of medications.

Mr. Nidhin explained the daily activities of a community pharmacist quoting a example for each of the activities including immunization, COVID management, health screening, Medication adherence, medication synchronization programs, compounding, collaborative work relationship. Also, he enlightened the participants about specialized daily activities of a community pharmacist such as nuclear medicine, palliative care, smoking session, nutritional counseling, infusions, total parenteral nutrition, dialysis and pain management. 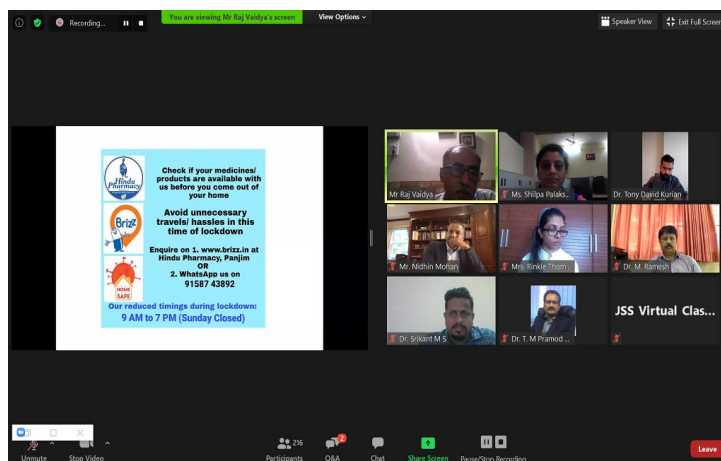




### "Experiences of Practicing Pharmacists during COVID 19: Global Scenario"

Webinar A Webinar on "Experiences of Practicing Pharmacists during COVID 19 : Global Scenario" was organized by department of Pharmacy Practice, JSS College of Pharmacy (JSSCP), JSS Academy of Higher Education & Research (JSS AHER), Mysuru on 16th June 2020 between 4.00 PM and 5:00 PM. Following were the objectives of the webinar: 1. To understand the practice adaptation of the pharmacist in the pandemic situation 2. To discuss the different strategies that can help pharmacist provide a better service in the pandemic situation. The webinar was started with the welcome & briefing on objectives of the webinar by Dr. M Ramesh, Professor & Head, JSSCP, Mysuru followed by opening remarks presented by Dr. T M Pramod Kumar, Principal, JSSCP, JSS AHER, Mysuru. Webinar was focused on sharing the experiences of pharmacist across the world. In this respect, the speakers of the webinar represented different global locations. 


### **“Utilising COVID-19 Pandemic to Strengthen the Dialogue of Access to Essential Medicines and Vaccines”**

Department of Pharmacy Practice, JSS College of Pharmacy, JSS Academy of Higher Education & Research, Mysuru conducted a webinar on the topic ‘Utilising COVID-19 Pandemic to Strengthen the Dialogue of Access to Essential Medicines and Vaccines’ on 12th August 2020 for the benefit of PharmD and M. Pharm Pharmacy Practice students. Dr.

**Sunitha Chandrashekar Srinivas**, Visiting Professor, Rhodes University, Grahamstown, South Africa was the resource person. The webinar was organised with an objective to identify the need and the importance of access to essential medicines during this COVID-19 pandemic. Dr. Sunitha Chandrashekar Srinivas, during her talk, she said “we find ourselves in one of the most challenging situations in history”. As the pandemic increasingly affects countries with underresourced health infrastructure and services, it is an ethical imperative to ensure that all people in all countries of the world are able to access essential medicines. This includes those medicines that are under international control. Governments should ensure that sufficient quantities of internationally controlled medicines, of assured quality, are available and affordable to people under medical care. Throughout the duration of the pandemic and beyond the acute phase of burden on the healthcare infrastructure, it is critical that governments work cooperatively to ensure that no country, no region, no district, no city and no patient is left behind. Competent national authorities, manufacturers, suppliers and distributors play a crucial role in ensuring that internationally controlled medicines urgently needed for medical treatment are available within and across national borders. The supply chain is the foundation of quality medical care because without the necessary supplies, including essential controlled medicines, patients will suffer. Also she highlighted that Governments are reminded that in acute emergencies, it is possible under the International Drug Control Conventions to utilize simplified control procedures for the export, transportation and supply of medicinal products containing controlled substances, especially in those cases where the competent authorities in the importing countries may not be operating at full capacity. Competent national authorities may permit the export of medicines containing narcotic drugs and/or psychotropic substances to affected areas even in the absence of the corresponding import authorizations and/or estimates. Urgent deliveries do not need to be included in the estimates of the receiving countries affected by emergencies. When possible, competent national authorities are also encouraged to issue electronic import and export authorizations through the INCB International Import and Export Authorization System (I2ES), PEN Online and share related contingency measures in the forum therein. Countries should ease COVID-19 related transport restrictions for controlled medicines and consider local production solutions when feasible, to meet the COVID-19 driven demand spikes. Further, she said about the adoption of the Agreement on Trade-Related Aspects of

Intellectual Property Rights (TRIPS Agreement), many Health Assembly resolutions have requested WHO to address the impact of trade agreements and intellectual property protection on public health and access to health products. The Global strategy and plan of action on public health, innovation and intellectual property, along with other relevant resolutions, constitutes the basic mandate for WHO's work in this area. As requested by the plan of action, WHO has intensified its collaboration with other relevant international organizations, in particular through trilateral collaboration with WIPO (The World Intellectual Property Organization) and World Trade Organisation, as well as with other organizations, including UNCTAD (The United Nations Conference on Trade and Development) and UNDP (The United Nations Development Programme). Trilateral cooperation with WIPO and WTO is fostering a better understanding of the linkage between public health and intellectual property policies and enhancing a mutually supportive implementation of those policies. This activity area supports countries by fostering innovation and access to health products through appropriate intellectual property rules and management and by providing technical support and capacity-building. There after she said that procurement and reimbursement of health products should be guided by evidence-based selection (including health technology assessment). Adoption or expansion of national essential medicines or diagnostics lists requires the capacity and competency at the national level to translate findings from evidence to local contexts and to use findings for decision-making. This activity area contributes directly to improving the availability and affordability of health products.

Actions will be carried out to support countries for appropriate selection of medicines, vaccines, diagnostics and other health products, transparent and fair pricing, and implementation of policies, including on the use of generic and biosimilar medicines to reduce costs to both governments and individuals while ensuring quality, safety and efficacy and sustainable supply. This will be particularly important for countries transitioning from donor funding. Additional work on support for evaluating the benefit of future technologies as they are developing will be carried out, in addition to the advancement of strategic approaches to ensuring supply security and other pricing and purchasing policies and thus she concluded her talk. Students interacted with her to clarify the doubts and thus the session came to the end.

The workshop was conducted by Mr. H.V. VISHVESH, 'ARIVU' Founder Director.


'ARIVU' follows the pedagogy of active learning i.e., experiential learning, and has the following ideas.
