



'Components of a Well Serving National Pharmacovigilance (PV) System' Department of Pharmacy Practice, JSS College of Pharmacy, JSS AHER, Mysuru organized an virtual guest lecture on the topic 'Components of Well Serving National a Pharmacovigilance (PV) System" on 2nd June 2021 for the benefit of PharmD and M. Pharm Pharmacy Practice students. Mr. Sten Olsson, Immediate-Past President, International Society of Pharmacovigilance and Adjunct Faculty, JSS Academy of Higher Education & Research, Mysuru was the resource person. The lecture was organized with the objective to enlighten participants on the requirements for setting up a national pharmacovigilance center and how national pharmacovigilance system works across the globe. Mr. Sten Olsson started the session by briefly explaining the different terminologies used in pharmacovigilance and then explained about exchanging safety information across the globe.

Mr. Sten, later explained the reporting of adverse drug reactions on a national scale with special emphasis in India wherein he emphasized on the reporting structure covering who can report, where to report, how to report suspected adverse reactions and also various modes of reporting.

Later, he addressed the participants on pharmacovigilance activities expected of Marketing Authorization Holder (MAH) wherein Mr. Sten emphasized about the different pharmacovigilance activities carried out by MAH and its importance in pharmacovigilance.

Students of fifth & sixth year PharmD, I & II M. Pharm Pharmacy Practice students and PhD research scholars attended the guest lecture. As it was an interactive session, students actively participated in the discussion, and the session was conducted using online platform.





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Challenges & Opportunities for Practicing Pharmacists during COVID-19 Pandemic Department of Pharmacy Practice, JSS College of Pharmacy, JSS Academy of Higher Education & Research (JSS AHER), Mysuru conducted a webinar on the topic 'Challenges & Opportunities for Practicing Pharmacists during COVID-19 Pandemic' for Practicing Pharmacists on 12th June 2021 between 11:00 AM to 12:30 PM. The webinar was conducted with an objective to provide a greater understanding of roles & responsibilities of practicing pharmacists during COVID-19 pandemic. Dr. M. Ramesh, Professor & Head, Department of Pharmacy Practice, JSS College of Pharmacy, JSS AHER, Mysuru presented the welcome note and briefed about objectives of the webinar. In his briefing, he mentioned that the pharmacists' role and responsibilities are expanding, and indeed pharmacists have a significant role to play during COVID-19 pandemic.

Mr. Raj Vaidya, Community Pharmacist, Hindu Pharmacy, Panaji, Goa delivered a talk on the topic "Challenges of Community Pharmacy in India during COVID-19 Pandemic". In his talk, he highlighted the community pharmacists' challenging role and responsibilities during the COVID-19 pandemic, measures to ensure during dispensing, need for upgradation of knowledge pertaining to the pandemic situation and also about the safety measures need to be taken during COVID-19 pandemic. Also, he emphasized on the need and importance of considering the Pharmacists as a front-line warriors and essential staff. Later, he briefed about E-consultation & E-Prescription. Mrs. M. Vijayalakshmi, Pharmacy Officer, Department of Health & Family Welfare, Government of Karnataka delivered a talk on "Challenges of Hospital Pharmacy in India during COVID-19 Pandemic". She briefed on various challenges faced by hospital pharmacists during COVID-19 pandemic and also highlighted the roles & responsibilities of hospital pharmacists in supply, procurement and inventory control of COVID-19 medications.

The last speaker for the webinar was Mrs. Shilpa Palaksha, Asst. Professor, Department of Pharmacy Practice, JSSCP, JSS AHER, Mysuru. She spoke on 'Extended Services of Pharmacists. During COVID-19 Pandemic'. In her talk, she mentioned that Practicing Pharmacists could provide various extended services for the betterment of public health especially during the COVID-19 pandemic. She emphasized on how small adaptation in the provision of the extended services can help in the promotion of safe and effective use of medicines in the time of pandemic. In her talk, she mentioned various services that



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pharmacists can provide to help the consumers, apart from the responsibility of dispensing. She concluded her talk by mentioning the prerequisite required to provide such extended services by the pharmacists.

Question & Answers session was quiet interesting as many participants posted questions pertaining to each topic, to which the speakers answered enthusiastically. More than 120 pharmacists participated in the webinar. Participants provided an excellent feedback on this webinar and they were happy with the content delivered through this webinar. Webinar participants were thankful to Dept. of Pharmacy Practice, JSSCP, JSS AHER, Mysuru for having organized the webinar on such a need-based topic.

Basic Life Support (BLS) and Advanced Cardiac Life Support (ACLS) Program for Pharm.D Interns

The Department of Pharmacy Practice organised a training session on 'Basic Life Support' (BLS) and 'Advanced Cardiac Life Support' (ACLS) for Pharm.D interns in the month of October 2021 in conjunction with JSS AHER Skills & Simulation Lab. Faculty from the JSS AHER Skills & Simulation Lab imparted the training to Pharm.D interns in two batches. Interns were provided with study materials for Basic Life Support & Advanced Cardiac Life Support well in advance to enable them to be prepared with the procedures and policies, prior to their training program. The training session was held for 3 days for each of the two batches, from 21st-23rd October 2021 and 28th-30th October 2021 for Batch I and Batch II respectively. The program instructors were Dr. K M Archana, Dr. Manthappa, Dr. S B Adarsh, Dr. Vyshnavi, Dr. S Archana, Dr. Harish and Dr. C R Venkatesh, Faculty from JSS Medical College & Hospital, JSS AHER, Mysuru. The first day of the program involved training of students about providing basic life support both in in-hospital and out-of-hospital scenarios. Introductory videos explaining the first steps to be performed in emergencies and life saving measures in cardiac arrest were displayed and following that a hands-on session on cardio-pulmonary resuscitation (CPR) was held using mannequins. Dr. K M Archana briefed the interns on the emergency activation codes for JSS Hospital and its activation process during the session. This session was followed by display of additional videos demonstrating the use of automated external defibrillator (AED), pocket masks & bag masks (Ambu-bag). The frequency and depth of compressions while providing CPR were



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demonstrated to the interns followed by a hands-on session on use of AED. This session was followed by a session on choking in adults and infants and first-aid measures to be taken in case of choking. Faculty trainers demonstrating the session on Cardio Pulmonary Resuscitation The following day of the program, a session on providing advance life support training was held. This session was intended only for those who are successfully completed the Basic Life Support training. During this session, the different types of treatment algorithms for different types of emergencies were taught to the participants. The different intubation techniques were also discussed. Students performing Cardio Pulmonary Resuscitation Following that a session on ECG patterns and its reading and interpretation was also held. Post cardiac arrest care was also taught to the interns. All the sessions were followed by practical learning through case scenarios using mannequins. On the third day, students wrote a written objective type test followed by a practical session where they were allowed to practice what they had learned in simulated settings of different type of emergencies. Postlunch, a practical exam was scheduled where students had to demonstrate the skills learned in scenarios with different emergency codes, and performance of Faculty trainer demonstrating the ECG during the session participants were evaluated. All the students showed keen interest in learning various aspects of life support and opined that the program has helped them to develop skills that will be of use to them in future for provision of such act of life support.






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'Risk Management Planning in Pharmacovigilance'


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interactive session, students actively participated in the discussion, and the session was conducted using online platform.



'National Pharmacovigilance Week 2021' Celebration Report on Sensitisation & Awareness Program on 'Importance of Reporting of Adverse Drug Reaction' As a part of celebration of 'National Pharmacovigilance Week 2021', The Regional Training Centre for South Zone -PvPI located at Department of Clinical Pharmacy, JSS Hospital, Mysuru in asociation with National Coordination Centre, Pharmacovigilance Program of India (PvPI), Indian Pharmacopeia Commission, Ghaziabad AND Special Interest Group (SIG) - Quality & Safe Use of Medicine conducted an Sensitisation & Awareness Program on 'Importance of Reporting of Adverse Drug Reaction' on 22nd September 2021 for the benefit of Nursing Incharges & Nursing Supervisors of JSS Hospital, Mysuru. The program was organised not only to create an awareness and inculcate reporting culture amongst them but also to further percolate this awareness and reporting culture among all the nursing staff of JSS hospital through those nursing in-charges and nursing supervisors who attended the sensitization and awareness program. Dr. Ch. Ascharya, Junior Pharmacovigilance Associate, Adverse Drug Reaction Monitoring Centre (AMC), JSS Medical College & Hospital, Mysuru welcomed the speakers and gathering. Further, Dr. Ch. Ascharya discussed about the basics of ADRs, and also briefed them on how to identify, and how & where to report the adverse event using any of the different modes of reporting. 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Program. Also, she explained the process of North American Pharmacy Eligibility Examination (NAPLEX) and discussed the criteria to maintain the licensure through the continuous professional development programs.

Department of Pharmaceutical Chemistry and coordinator of the workshop proposed vote of thanks.




National webinar on "Role of Artificial intelligence in Sustainable Development Goals and Health"

March 24th is observed as World Tuberculosis Day. In this regard a talk was organized by the Department of Microbiology for faculties, research scholars and post graduate students.

Dr Krishna Kurthkoti, who has extensively worked on Mycobacteria was invited to address and share his research experience on 8th March 2022 at 11.30AM in seminar hall of School of Life Sciences.
