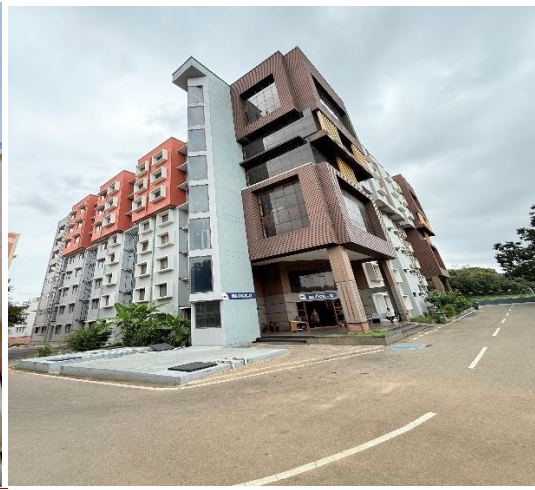

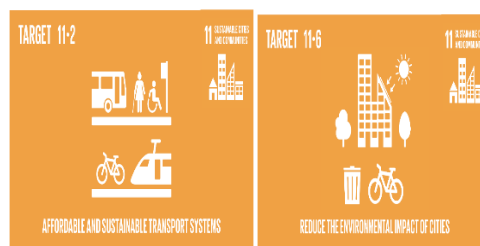

By encouraging and adopting cycling and providing bus transit, the institute is working towards reducing air pollution, minimising CO₂ emissions from the vehicles.





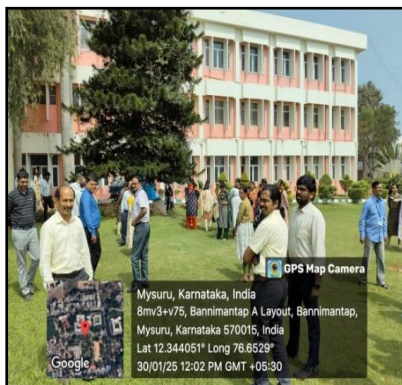
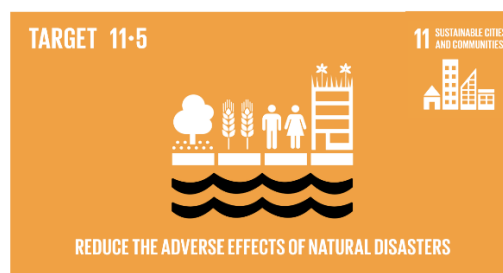

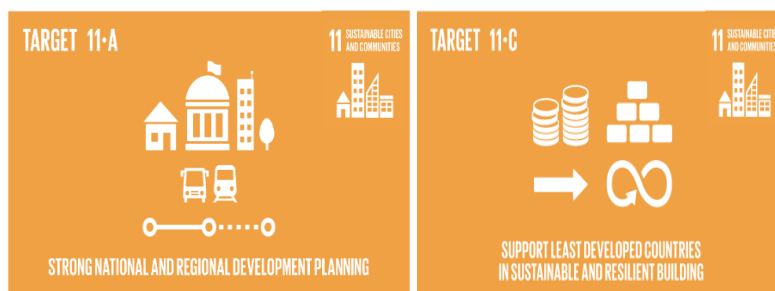

Healthy living standards and wellbeing of urban population:

At JSS Medical College, JSS Academy of Higher Education & Research, several outreach activities are conducted for the wellbeing of people through JSS Urban Health Center located at Medhar Block, Bamboo Bazaar, Mysuru and other rural (Primary Health Centres at Suttur, Kadakola, Hadinaru) and urban field practice areas (Urban Primary Health Centre at Bannimantap, Mysuru), the families in the villages (Hancya,

Rammanahalli, Hale Kesare, K R Mill, Suttur) are adopted under Family adoption programme for a minimum of three years by the MBBS students to address the health issues of the family members in the village and under family health advisory survey- families in the field practice area are surveyed every year by the students under the guidance of Department of Community Medicine.

Reaching the unreached through Chamarajanagar Hospital, Megha Health camp, Religious Funfairs, Mobile Health Camps at rural settings, Health camps under Public Private Partnerships and through National Service scheme (NSS). These camps benefit the people in rural areas by addressing the health issues at their doorsteps.

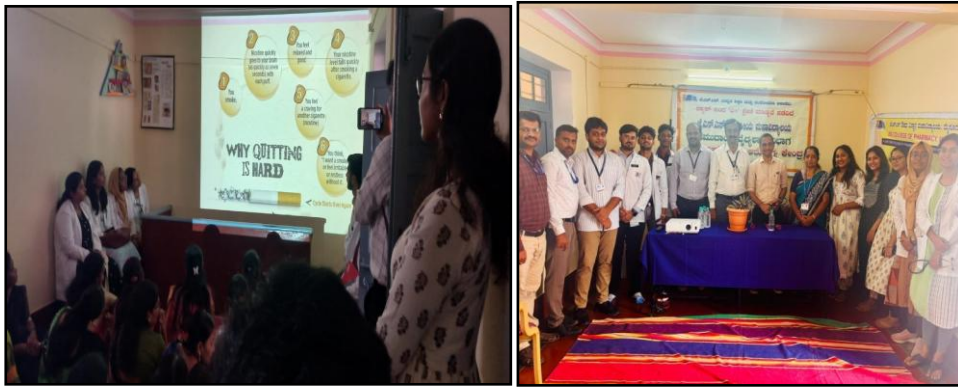
World Diabetes Day - 14.11.2024

World Environmental Day – 05-06-2025

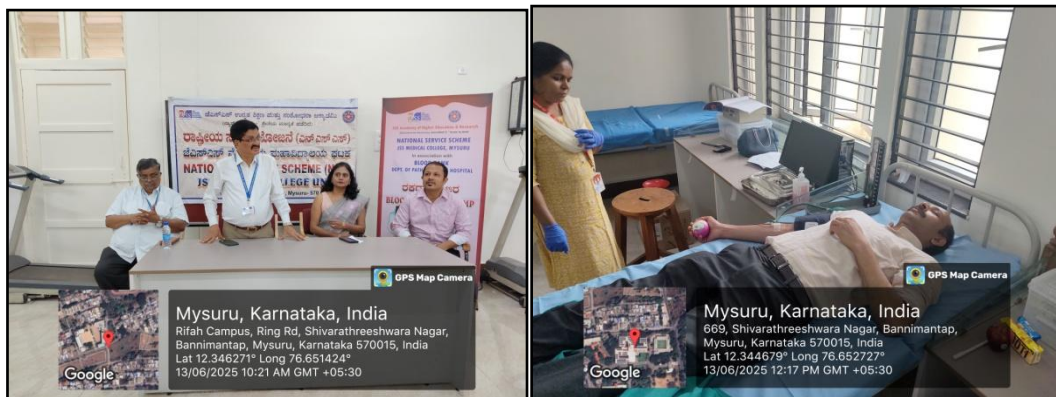

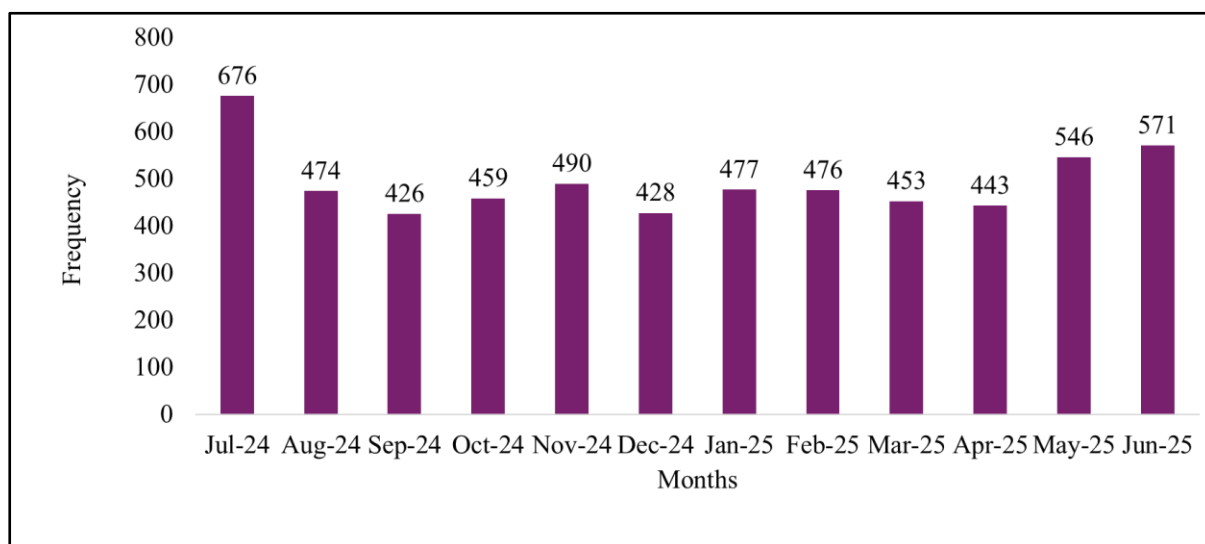

4. Protecting and preserving the world's cultural and natural heritage.
5. Greatly reducing the number of deaths and people affected by disasters and substantially cutting direct economic losses relative to global GDP, particularly from water-related disasters, with a priority on aiding the poor and vulnerable populations.
6. Ensuring universal access to safe, inclusive, and accessible green and public spaces, especially for women and children, the elderly, and persons with disabilities.
7. Encouraging positive economic, social, and environmental linkages between urban, peri-urban, and rural areas by reinforcing national and regional development planning.
8. Strengthening efforts to conserve the world's cultural and natural heritage.
9. Substantially increasing, by 2020, the number of cities and human settlements adopting and applying integrated policies and plans for inclusion, resource efficiency, climate change mitigation and adaptation, disaster resilience, and aligning with the Sendai Framework for Disaster Risk Reduction 2015–2030.
10. Providing support to least developed countries—through financial and technical assistance—to construct sustainable and resilient buildings using locally sourced materials.

SDG 11 aims to foster sustainable and inclusive urban areas and settlements that ensure equal access to housing, transportation, basic services, and green spaces. It emphasizes participatory planning, disaster preparedness, preservation of cultural and natural heritage, and integration between urban and rural areas. Through sustainable urbanization, SDG 11 aspires to enhance the quality of life in cities, support environmental sustainability, and create inclusive social and economic growth.

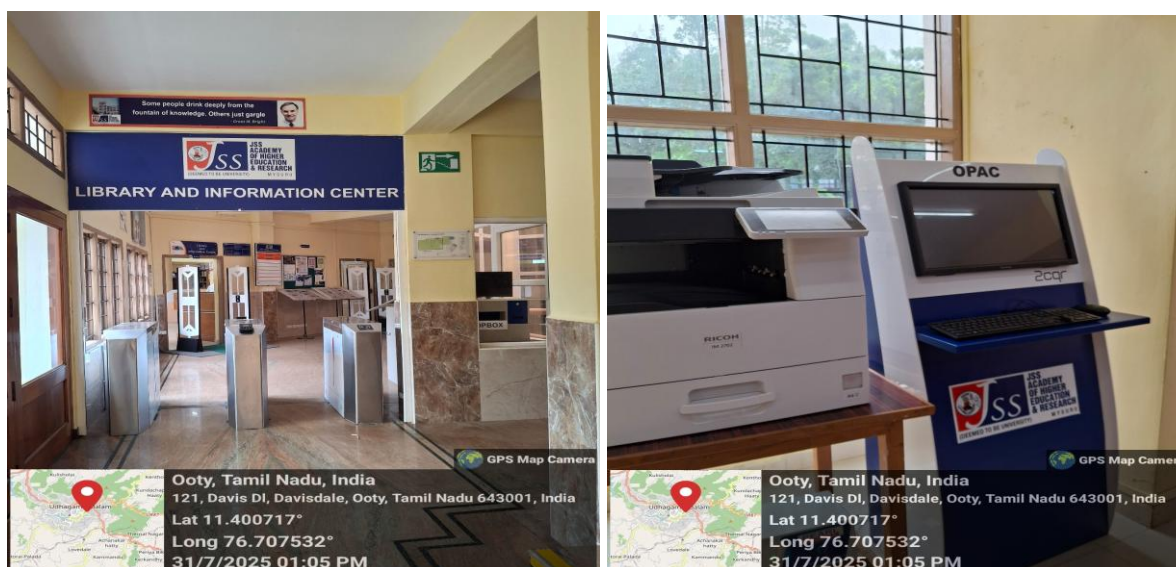

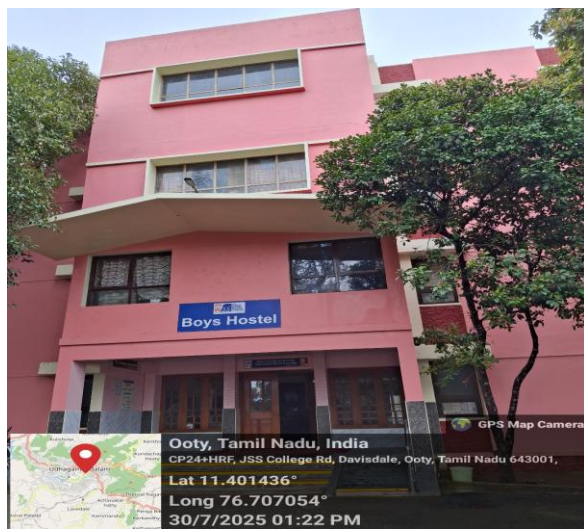
