# Institutional Ethics Committee (IEC) at JSS Medical College



The Institutional Ethics Committee, JSS Medical College (IEC, JSS MC) Members with the supporting staff members.

Institutional Ethics Committee (IEC) at JSS Medical College was initiated in 1993. The Principal JSS Medical College, is the Authority under whom the Ethics committee is established and is functioning. The research involving human participants are reviewed by the Ethics Committee to keep the research within the ethical framework and standards. IEC upholds the task of reviewing the scientific, ethical, medical, and social aspects of research proposals received by it in an objective, timely and independent manner by attending meetings, participation in discussion and deliberations. The IEC serves to protect the rights, safety, and well-being of the research participants. The institution has provided adequate infrastructure, staff, space, funds, required support and protected time for the member secretary which has helped in the smooth and independent functioning of the Ethics committee. IEC, JSSMC is involved in ethical review and approval of both the academic and regulatory clinical research proposals and functions as per the SOPs framed following the national ethical and Good Clinical Practice (GCP) guidelines. Since its inception, the IEC, JSSMC is consistently and progressively performing better year by year. This has been reflected by the good track record with the timely regulatory registrations and quality accreditations.

IEC, JSSMC was registered with Regulatory agency, CDSCO (Central Drugs Standard Control Organisation) in 2013. From then the IEC has been timely re-registered every 3 years i.e., 2016, 2019, and June 2022 by fulfilling all the regulatory requirements of CDSCO. Our present CDSCO registration is valid for 5 years from 2022- 2027. Also, our Ethics Committee is Provisional

registered with the National Ethics Committee Registry for Biomedical and Health Research (NECRBHR), Department of Health Research (DHR) in May 2022 for the approval of Biomedical and Health Research.

NABH Quality Accreditation of IEC, JSSMC: - Our IEC has fulfilled all the Quality requirements of NABH by undergoing NABH Accreditation inspection and received the Accreditation in April 2018, Surveillance inspection in September 2020 and Re Accreditation inspection in March 2021. NABH assessment was conducted on 22-23 June 2024 for its Re accreditation.

The committee also operates in accordance with SOP laid down. The latest is IEC SOP ver 5 dt 07-03-2024. All the EC details with registrations and accreditations, proposal formats, IEC composition, SOPs and resource materials are updated in the Institutional Website and updated regularly.

Presently, Our IEC, JSSMC is monitoring around 30 approved ongoing clinical trials and any Serious Adverse Events (SAEs) occurring in the clinical trial will be assessed and intimated to the CDSCO through an online portal within the specified time duration. The academic projects of the students of different courses and faculty from various colleges under JSS AHER along with the projects from other JSS institutes as well as external projects from other institutes which have an MoU with our institute are reviewed and approved by the committee.

IEC, JSSMC is a multi-disciplinary and multi-sectoral team of 13 members with adequate representation of age and gender and balance between medical and non-medical as well as affiliated and non-affiliated members.

Dr. M. Srinivasa, Senior consultant, Kamakshi Hospital, Mysore is the Chairman of the IEC.

Dr. C. Prathima, Associate Professor of Pharmacology is the Member secretary (Regulatory trials) of IEC, JSSMC. Dr Shiva Prakash, Associate Professor of Anatomy is the Member secretary (Academic studies) of IEC, JSSMC. Dr Pratibha Pereira Professor and Head, Dept of Geriatrics, JSS Medical College & Hospital and Dr. Srinath K.M, Professor, Dept of General Medicine, JSS Medical College & Hospital are the clinician members. Dr. Kalabharathi H. L, Professor of Pharmacology, JSSMC and Dr. Smitha Rani Assistant Professor of Forensic Medicine, JSSMC are the Basic Medical Scientists. Smt. Sudha Phaneesh Secretary, Samarpana Trust, J.P. Nagar, Mysuru and Smt. H.S. Sandhya, Treasurer of Inner wheel club of Mysore Mid town are serving as Social Scientists. Sri. R.S. Nagaraj, Secretary, Shree Vanamali Charitable trust, Mysore and Dr. Sathyanarayana Mamatha, Assistant. Professor, Dept of Hindi, De Paul

Degree College, Mysore are serving as laypersons. Mr. Palaksha and Mr. Nithin HN are the legal experts. Dr. Sri Harsha Chalasani, Assistant Professor, Dept of Pharmacy Practice, JSS College of Pharmacy, Mysore is the Scientific member. Mrs. Esther Sushmitha, M Pharm is serving as the coordinator of the committee. There are also 3 supporting staff members to ensure the smooth functioning of the committee.

Every member of the committee has been competent and has contributed to the effective conduct of all IEC activities with adequate institutional support.

EC members are regularly trained about the recent regulatory and ethical guidelines. Regular workshop on SOP and GCP are also conducted by the EC office.





# **Child Abuse Response Unit**

The Child Abuse Response Unit was officially launched at JSS Hospital in November 2016.

The objective of this unit is to provide care in a manner that complies with regulations and ensure safety of the child who is suspected or is reported to have been a victim of Child abuse.

Various departments like Paediatrics, Obstetrics and Gynaecology, Psychiatry, Forensic Medicine, Emergency medicine and nursing team are the part of this initiative who join forces following a single alert. A multi-disciplinary team is sensitive to the different problems and the whole process is kept confidential. Those patients who require such care, are immediately shifted to a private room and a neutral environment is created and one screening is conducted and forensic samples are collected. No multiple examinations are done thus minimizing the trauma to the patient. All the team members are trained in counselling, treatment, and well versed with legal aspects pertaining to such cases.

Student Support Center (SSC) is formed at JSS AHER, Mysuru with the support of the Department of Psychiatry and the Department of Clinical Psychology.

# **Student Support Centre**

Student Support Center (SSC) provides free and confidential direct individual counselling services for a variety of concerns including, stress, burnout, time management, relationship problems, anxiety, depression, and other matters related to a student's overall mental well-being. The Center also provides resource information on wellness topics and is responsible for student outreach programming designed to reduce stress and improve overall well-being.



#### Objectives

- To offer practical and constructive support to students in adjusting to a new environment as well as social or personal challenges that are specific to their age group and circumstances.
- To spread awareness about ways to cope with academic pressures that often lead to mental health difficulties, and to assist students with the academic


concerns that emerge from dealing with any short or long-term health condition.

# <u>AikyaMind - One-Stop Shop For Managing Your Mental Health.</u>



#### 2. Substance Abuse – Signs & Symptoms: Its Identification in Living and Deceased

- The session highlighted forensic approaches to identifying substance abuse, both in living patients and post-mortem cases.

# 3. Advances in Diagnostic Biochemistry: Technologies for Estimating Toxic Analytes in Serum and Urine

Presented by Dr.Surabhi K.R., Postgraduate, Department of Biochemistry.

 This talk covered innovative biochemical techniques and advancements in diagnosing toxic analytes associated with substance abuse, with implications for patient care and forensic investigations.

His inputs emphasized the role of multidisciplinary approaches in addressing addiction and related disorders, enhancing the discussion's depth. # Workshops

# GEOSPATIAL SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY (LEVEL 1: STANDARD PROGRAM – ASCLEPIUS 2024 – 24-10-2024

The CSI Workshop conducted as part of Asclepius, the international medical conference of JSS Medical College, on 24.10.2024 was an engaging and hands-on event designed to introduce participants to the practical aspects of forensic investigations. The workshop was inaugurated by Dr.Chandrakanth H. V., Professor and Head of the Department of Forensic Medicine and Toxicology, along with Dr.G.B.Aravind, Associate Professor, and Ms.Mridusmita, the organizer of the workshop.

The session commenced with a welcome address by Dr.Chandrakanth H.V., followed by an introductory speech by Dr.G.B.Aravind. Delegates were provided with an online handbook and a portfolio to facilitate a better understanding of the workshop activities.

The practical session included three simulated crime scenes. Delegates were divided into groups and assigned station numbers. Each group spent 15 minutes at a crime scene, observing and identifying evidence, and documenting their findings in the provided folder. After completing all three stations, the storyline of the crime, set against the backdrop of a wedding, was explained by Ms. Rayna, the workshop organizer. Four suspects were introduced, paving the way for further investigation.

The second phase of the workshop involved forensic activities at three stations. At the Blood Analysis Station, participants collected blood samples under supervision for analysis. The Fingerprint Analysis Station allowed delegates to create their own handprint impressions, which they could take home as souvenirs. The Red Hands Station provided a practical demonstration of its forensic relevance.

At the conclusion of the workshop, Dr.Smitha Rani, Associate Professor in the Department of Forensic Medicine and Toxicology, provided a detailed briefing, linking the evidence to the crime and elaborating on the storyline. Delegates actively participated in discussions and shared their opinions on the identity of the murderer. The suspects were presented, and the final reveal was conducted by Ms. Rayna and Ms.Mridusmita, who explained the plot and resolution of the case.

The workshop concluded with a feedback session where delegates expressed their enthusiasm and appreciation for the well-organized and interactive event. Through its hands-on approach and immersive activities, the workshop successfully provided participants with practical insights into forensic investigations.

#### Day 5:



# Where Manodharma meets Modernity




#### Introduction

## Hands-on workshop on Perio-Plastic Surgery








## **ABOUT SDG 16- PEACE, JUSTICE AND STRONG INSTITUTIONS**




#### **Blood Donation Camp 2025**

4<sup>th</sup> Feb 2024, Cancer Awareness Program 2024

**Venue** : Government Botanical Garden, the Nilgiris.

Department of Pharmacy practice JSS College of Pharmacy, Ooty jointly with IPA Nilgiris local branch, Rotary Club Nilgiris West, Rotaract Club of JSSCP, and BS hospital, Ooty organized a Cancer Awareness program at the Government Botanical Garden, Ooty. The program was sponsored by JSSAHER, Mysuru, and aimed to raise awareness about the cancer risk factors, the importance of diagnosis, screening, vaccination, treatment, and prevention of cancer among the public & tourists. A total of 7 volunteers from V PharmD actively involved in the health screening activities of the program, 5 faculty members delivered their counseling addressing each topic related to cancer and there were around 500 participants benefited from the program. Firstly, the program began with finger imprinting by the Manager, Govt. Botanical Garden & Vice Principal in the fingerprinting tree, followed by the public and tourists had imprinted their fingerprints and pledged to fight against cancer and filled out a feedback form for this program. The students counseled the public on the unusual symptoms of cancer, when should they go to a physician for a check-up, and the importance of regular screening for the prevention of cancer, self-detection of breast tumours, etc. There were more than 50 feedback forms filled by the public and around 200 fingerprints were recorded. Dr Deepalakshmi M, Assistant Professor JSSCP, Ooty the co-ordinator of the program highlighted the importance of cancer awareness and the free diagnostic checkups available in the Government Medical College Hospital, Ooty, and a free Pap smear test for about 10 beneficiaries were carried out at BS hospital, Ooty.

The other staff along with V Pharm D students counseled the public regarding the types of cancer, general signs and symptoms of cancer, and healthy lifestyle measures to prevent cancer and distributed Cancer Awareness Pamphlets. Since obesity is one of the risk factors for Cancer, BMI was checked and necessary counseling was given to obese patients. Apart from counseling activities, a one-minute plank challenge was conducted for the participants as an initiative of daily exercise for a healthy lifestyle. The participants were encouraged and were given a plant sapling in appreciation of their efforts. The plank challenge was a great success as it attracted tourists, and few physicians, professionals, foreign tourists, and the general public actively participated.

The volunteers actively educated the public with sufficient points regarding cancer and created a general cancer awareness video that attracted the public. The event was a resounding success, through informative counseling, and screening, the program encouraged valuable insights on awareness of cancer. The program received positive feedback from the participants in attendance, indicating a desire for similar initiatives in the future.



## 24th March 2024, World Tuberculosis Day 2024

Venue: Avataa, Billimalai Tea Estate, Selas

The Department of Pharmacy Practice, JSS College of Pharmacy, Ooty in association with IPA Nilgiris Local Branch and Rotaract organized an outreach program on 24.03.2024 at Avataa, Billimalai Tea Estate, Selas to mark World Tuberculosis Day. The program aimed to raise awareness among the audience about the importance of tuberculosis prevention and overall well-being.

Dr. Deepalakshmi M gave an informative educational session on tuberculosis, discussing its epidemiology, prevention, and treatment options. She elaborated on the importance of finishing the entire course of medicine in order to prevent drug resistance, as well as the role of public health activities in reducing TB spread. Her talk not only provided valuable information but also inspired awareness and proactive measures among the audience. Informative videos about tuberculosis were showcased in the regional language, aiming to enhance understanding and awareness among the audience. This approach helps bridge language barriers, ensuring vital information reaches a wider audience and promotes better comprehension and engagement with tuberculosis-related topics. Participants were also provided with informative pamphlets detailing education about tuberculosis, its symptoms, patient counseling, and treatment options. This distribution aids in spreading awareness and equipping individuals with essential knowledge for early detection, proper management, and support during the treatment journey for tuberculosis-related concerns.

Seventy participants actively participated in the outreach program, where they benefited from a routine general check-up. The program included assessments for vital health indicators such as blood pressure, pulse rate, height, weight, and blood sugar levels. These screenings are crucial for early detection and management of potential health issues, promoting overall well-being among participants. The initiative reflects a proactive approach to healthcare, empowering individuals to monitor and take charge of their health status. By reaching out to a significant number of participants, the program contributes significantly to community health

awareness and encourages healthy lifestyle practices for a better quality of life. The DOTS Mobile Van from NTEP was present at the event. As part of its services, Chest X-ray screenings were conducted for all 70 participants. This mobile healthcare unit brings diagnostic capabilities to communities, facilitating early detection and monitoring of TB cases. The Chest X-ray screenings play a crucial role in identifying TB-related abnormalities in the lungs, allowing for prompt medical intervention and treatment initiation when needed. The presence of such comprehensive services underscores the commitment to proactive healthcare management and disease prevention within the community.

To create awareness among staff and students, posters on gender harassment were displayed across all the departments, boys and gents hostel.

#### **Anti-Ragging Committee**

As per the policies and regulations of Anti-Ragging Committee, JSSAHER, The Department of Health System Management Studies displays posters on "Ragging is a Punishable Offence" on the notice boards to be viewed by the students, parents, and visitors. A session on Anti-Ragging policy will also be conducted as a part of the student induction program to make students and parents aware of the existing policies and create a conducive learning environment and student friendly culture in the department.
