Student Admission Policy and Procedures is for the application and admission of students into different programmes offered by JSS AHER campuses.

“Definition of “Deemed-To-Be University”-

“An Institution of Higher Education, other than universities, working at a very high standard in specific area of study, which is declared by the Central Government on the advice of the UGC as an Institution Deemed-to-be-university.”

JSS AHER - Deemed to be University is committed to follow the regulations and guidelines on admissions stipulated by the statutory & regulatory bodies such as University Grants Commission (UGC), National Medical Commission (NMC), Dental Council of India (DCI), Pharmacy Council of India (PCI), Rehabilitation Council of India (RCI), All India council for Technical Education (AICTE) Central & State and Medical Counselling Committee (MCC) and Honourable Supreme Court of India.

JSS AHER - Admission Section provides necessary guidance to all the applicants and ensures that the interests, rights and needs of prospective candidates who are looking for educational opportunities in various courses at JSS AHER are attended.

Purpose -

JSS AHER is committed to ensure its admission policies and procedures are fair, transparent, ethical and timely, making study accessible to a diverse range of prospective students. This policy outlines admissions processes and requirements for UG, PG, Diploma and Certificate courses by JSS AHER as per the policies formed from time to time.

Scope -

- All campuses (including online)
- Domestic & International students enrolling in Higher Education for UG, PG, Diploma and Certificate courses.

General Principles -

- The policy and procedures provide equal opportunities to all the students and fulfil the educational needs of the differently abled.
- Students are given unbiased guidance or advice.
- Students have the right to appeal about any aspect of the way in which their application or admission was managed.
- JSS AHER has the right to cancel any programme onto which students have been accepted, in accordance with its rules and regulations.

JSS Academy of Higher Education & Research has allotted **10%** of seats for candidates from economically weaker section (**EWS**).

Implementation of Policy and Procedures -

- The students applying individually will be made aware of the terms of admissions policy and procedures by the Admission Facilitation Cell of the JSS AHER.
- Admission Facilitation Cell of JSS AHER monitors the student application and admission process, by providing the materials and means for application to the students.
- All the applications are processed by the Admission Facilitation Cell of JSS AHER in accordance with students Admissions policy and procedures.
- The entry requirements like students age, academic qualification etc., are scrutinized by Admission Facilitation Cell of JSS AHER.

The JSS AHER shall ensure -

1. Relevant and Comprehensive information such as courses/programs offered, eligibility criteria, procedure and details of common entrance test (Names of the centres, number of papers for the written test, dates and venue of test etc.,) shall be widely publicized in digital and print media and by Notifying in JSS AHER's official website.
2. JSS AHER will prepare an update prospectus which provides detailed information on the vision and mission of JSS AHER, details of recognition and approvals from the various statutory authorities (National and International bodies), courses offered, duration of the course, course pattern, entry requirement, eligibility criteria, job opportunity, mode of selection, collaborative arrangements with International Universities, details of research programs etc.,
3. JSS AHER will follow the seat sharing Policy's as approved by the Board of Management and other competent authorities for admission of students.
4. The details of various infrastructural facilities such as an academic facility, library facilities, Laboratories, facilities to develop through physical education residential and other facility, etc., will be provided in the prospectus.
5. The prospectus shall provide the details of academic governance of JSS AHER and comprehensive information in respect of students' career placements.
6. Candidates who wish to apply for various courses offered and conducted by JSS AHER may submit online application by uploading the relevant documents required during submission of online application form at JSS AHER website for considering the application to the entrance test/admission.

JSS AHER - Admission Section is committed to enact and follow the admission procedure which ensures that there will be transparency in the entire admission process. Some of the important steps followed for admitting at JSS AHER are as under

- The criteria for admission to any course is based on the academic merit, performance in the entrance test and personal interview.
- The entrance test shall be All India level.
- As per the instructions and guidelines of statutory bodies, Admission Facilitation Cell undergoes the process of making admissions through online only.
- JSS AHER reserves the right to admit or refuse entry to any applicant based on an individual's ability to meet the educational and financial requirements of the course, including the Inherent Course Requirements (where stated) for the course into which they are applying for admission.
- Medical fitness tests are to be done for the specified courses.
- The Registrar, JSS AHER shall issue Provisional Admission Letter to the selected candidates as per the policies.
- In case of non-admission of the selected candidate for any reasons, candidates who are waitlisted shall be allowed to join the program.
- The Admission Section maintains the records of all student applications and documents submitted at the time of admission.

Admission Entry Requirements -

To support a successful study experience with JSS AHER, applicants are required to meet the following eligibility/entry requirements:

1. The minimum entry requirement allows an applicant to be considered for selection/admission.
2. Students entering higher education-diploma, bachelor's degree or undergraduate courses are expected to have completed Year 12th Class /Intermediate or 10+2 /qualifying exam issued by the Valid Education Board or an equivalent qualification and as prescribed by the statutory body and JSS AHER.
3. For undergraduate courses, candidates must have completed 17 years of age as on December 31st of the admission year.
4. Students entering higher education in Postgraduate degree/Diploma courses are expected to have completed graduation from a recognized university with minimum aggregate percentage (as prescribed) in bachelor's degree in respective discipline or equivalent (10+2+3) from a recognized university and as prescribed by the statutory body's and JSS AHER. Students appearing for their final semester / year exams are also eligible to apply for entrance test/admission.
5. Minimum entry requirements are specified in the relevant course approval instrument approved by the UGC/ NMC/DCI/PCI/AICTE/RCI/AERB/JSS AHER and Hon'ble Supreme Court of India.
6. The criteria for minimum entry requirements are approved in the Academic Council & Board of Management of JSS AHER and the same is provided at JSS AHER website, in the Information Bulletin.

Process Requirements -

- All eligible candidates must submit the online application at JSS AHER website www.jssuni.edu.in as per the admission calendar announced.
- A non-refundable application fee for the preferred program should be paid through Online Payment gateway Mode with the valid Credit Card / Debit Card or Net Banking facility.
- Candidate must fulfil all eligibility requirement as prescribed by the statutory body and JSS AHER from time to time for admission.
- Candidate must appear for JSS entrance test scheduled by JSS AHER to determine the merit of the candidature for admissions as per the calendar of events announced (Where applicable)
- It is the responsibility of all potential students to read and understand the Inherent course requirements for the course into which they are seeking admission and accept the Inherent course requirements prior to initial enrolment to the respective courses.
- For undergraduate courses, candidates must have completed 17 years of age as on December 31st of the admission year.
- JSS AHER reserves the right to change / alter the dates or timing at any given time during the application process.
- Candidates are required to show evidence of English language proficiency to a certain level depending on the courses & admission to ensure that the student can successfully engage to study in the selected field.
- If the application is incomplete or incorrect, JSS AHER has the right to reject it

Selection / counselling committees' composition and procedures -

To support a successful study experience with JSS AHER, applicants are required to meet the following eligibility/entry requirements:

1. Admission process is done in accordance with the prescribed guidelines by statutory and regulatory bodies.
2. The regulation of NMC/ DCI/ PCI/ AICTE/RCI/AERB provides that where an institution of All India character is there, such as JSS AHER, the institution has to conduct entrance examination on All India basis and to admit the students based on merit. However, admissions to the Medical / Dental UG/PG programs will be based on the NEET eligibility as notified by the government of India/ NMC /DCI and MCC of DGHS.
3. Admission Notification will be notified through print media and in JSS AHER's website
4. The rank list is prepared by JSS AHER from the marks secured in the qualifying exam and or an entrance exam conducted by the designated authority of the Government of India / institution as may be notified from time to time by the Government of India /institution
5. Selection decisions shall be made by the authority of the selection committee with due attention to equity and consistency.
6. The selection committee selects only from among applicants eligible for consideration under the minimum entry requirements approved by the Board, including the English standard for the course.
7. To determine the eligibility, and ranking eligible applicants, the selection committee will consider:
 - The guidelines on the interpretation of resolutions for selection.
 - The rules for ranking applicants; and
 - The schedule on use of selection instruments, determined by the Committee and published on JSS AHER website.

Original documents submission -

The applicant(s) should compulsorily submit the following documents in original at the time of admission/ reporting:

- » JSS AHER admission offer letter
- » Entrance Test Hall Ticket (where applicable)
- » Downloaded JSS AHER Application Form duly signed by the Applicant/ Parent
- » 10th Marks Sheet
- » 12th Marks Sheet
- » Mark statement of all the semesters / year of their bachelor's degree. Applicant(s) who are pursuing their final semester / year need to submit mark statements up to the preceding semester / year
- » Provisional Degree Certificate, if Candidate has completed / graduated
- » Degree Certificate (Convocation Certificate) if candidate has graduated
- » Transfer Certificate from last institution studied (qualifying examination)-Mandatory
- » Migration Certificate other than Karnataka 12 board candidates)-Mandatory
- » Copy of Aadhar & PAN card of the candidate and Parents
- » Copy of Passport and Visa (if available) for international applicant(s)
- » 5 recent passport and 5 stamp size colour photographs in formal dress (Standard Indian Passport size)
- » Medical fitness certificate - tests are to be done for the required courses.
- » Attested Photocopy of Caste certificate as per the central / State government format (OBC/SC/ST) (As applicable)

Transfer between courses -

1. JSS AHER authority and concerned college Principal may approve an application to transfer into a course / college for which they are responsible from another course at JSS AHER.
2. When making decisions on applications to transfer between courses, factors that JSS AHER considers include:
 - Prerequisites and other admission requirements for the course
 - The availability of seat as per statutory policy.
 - Regulatory requirements/Approvals (Wherever necessary) and
 - The academic competitiveness of the applicant.

The application for cancellation should be submitted by the candidate in-person by presenting the following:

1. The Registrar may approve the withdrawal offer or cancel the admission and enrolment of a student where:
 - The candidate fails to provide documents or to fulfil other requirements specified in the offer of admission by the specified date.
 - The offer of admission has been made based on incomplete, inaccurate, or fraudulent information provided by the candidate/student or a third party on behalf of the candidate/student.
 - The person fails to enrol in accordance with the offer of admission by the specified date.
 - The person arrives late for a teaching period or does not engage with or genuinely begin his or her studies before a date determined and as advised by JSS AHER.
 - In the reasonable opinion of the Registrar the authority is holding open, or intends to hold open, his or her offer or enrolment for purposes other than genuine study.
 - The Registrar determines that it is necessary or reasonable to withdraw the offer in order to fulfil regulatory or administrative requirements or guidelines; or
 - The Registrar becomes aware that appropriate supervision or other resources are no longer available to support the applicant's admission; or
 - The course is withdrawn from offer as a result of JSS AHER decision.
2. Original fee paid receipt, document submission receipt and any other documents that had been received from JSS AHER.
3. No email, telephonic or courier / postal communication will be accepted for cancellation / refund process.
4. No candidate will be entitled for a refund on or after the date of commencement of classes.

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JSS AHER- FEE POLICY

Payment of Tuition Fees Policy-

This policy sets out important financial aspects governing institutions time as a student at JSS Academy of Higher Education & Research (Deemed to be University). It should be read alongside the Terms and Conditions and Admission Offer Letter for current academic year of entry. This policy applicable between the students & JSS AHER”.

This policy applies to Diploma, Undergraduate, Postgraduate and Postgraduate research students.

Purpose -

- JSS Academy of Higher Education & Research (JSSAHER), Mysuru operates sustainably as a not-for-profit organisation. It reviews and publishes its fee structure annually in its website www.jssuni.edu.in .
- JSSAHER, Mysuru is committed to have a fair and transparent policy in respect of fee structure.
- The policy has been developed to enable students to keep properly informed and aims to assist students to decide the paying the fees.
- This policy explains, ways in which students can settle the fees and about the refund policy.
- It outlines the consequences of non-payment of fees.
- This policy is designed to ensure compliance with all applicable regulatory requirements of bodies.
- The policy is reviewed annually, and the students will be informed about the terms of this policy as a part of the registration process at the start of each academic year. Details of changes made in this policy will be made available in the JSS AHER website (www.jssuni.edu.in).

Scope -

- This Policy applicable to all the students (who wish to admit/admits) JSS AHER, Mysuru.

Principles of Fee Structure -

- JSS AHER, Mysuru will ensure that the Policy of Fee structure is operated fairly and consistently across the constituent colleges, schools and departments of JSSAHER.
- In addition to tuition fees, students have to pay other fees levied by or on behalf of JSS AHER, Mysuru and may include fees for labs, library, exam and breakages etc.
- Additional charges and the terms and conditions which apply to those charges will be published and communicated to students periodically.
- Students retain ultimate responsibility for the payment of prescribed fees, whether invoiced or not, including approved sponsorship agreements.
- Students have to pay prescribed fees semester/annual fees at the time of their initial enrolment to the programme.
- Under exceptional circumstances, JSS AHER, Mysuru retains the right to approve the payment of fees in instalments (Education Loan/scholarship/ sponsorship).
- Students, who fail to pay fees due, will not be permitted/eligible for admission to any of the examinations.
- No student shall under any circumstances will be allowed to appear for examinations without furnishing the "No Dues" Certificate from the concerned Heads of the College/schools/Department of JSS AHER.
- No degree or qualification of JSS AHER, Mysuru shall be issued to a student who has not discharged all his/her financial obligations of College/schools/Department of JSS AHER, Mysuru.
- The JSS AHER reserves the right to alter fees or other charges without notice.

UGC Policy-

As per University Grants Commission (UGC) notification dated October 2018, in para 4.1.2;

- All Higher Education Institutions shall charge the fee in advance only for the semester/year in which a student is to engage for the academic activities.
- Collecting advance fees for the entire programme of study or more than one semester / year in which a student is enrolled is strictly prohibited.
- JSS AHER may collect the fee in advance for the semester/year in which a student is to engage in academic activities.

Payment of Course/Tuition Fee -

Enrolment/admission will usually take place in the 8 - 10 week of period before course/class starts, and the tuition fees shall be paid in semester/year in which a student is to engage in academic activities.

Unless one or more of the following applies:

1. Student who is paying their academic fees, who has paid a 50% of the fees, and are planning to pay the remaining of the tuition fees before starting of course/Class starts.
2. A student who is being sponsored by an approved external sponsor and have provided evidence of that sponsorship to the University.
3. The students who have provided evidence that they are receiving an educational loan from Finance institutions.
4. The Postgraduate student and who have provided evidence that you are receiving a postgraduate / postgraduate research loan / scholarship from any Finance Authorities.
5. The student who has provided evidence that they are receiving an undergraduate or postgraduate / postgraduate research Government supported loan from any Government/country of origin.
6. The student who is being funded via a Government apprenticeship levy or, where the Education and Skills Funding Agency is paying of their tuition fees.
7. The student who is being funded, for 100% of your postgraduate research degree tuition fees by the University.
8. The overseas private funded student, then must pay 50% of the Full tuition fee for the course before completion of enrolment. The full tuition fee is the fee charged for the enrolled course prior to the deduction of any scholarship awards. Non-payment of the 50% prior to enrolment will result in a hold to the student enrolment and a referral to the JSS AHER Finance section to discuss further options.

Fee payment options -

1. If candidates are paying tuition/course fees, payments shall be made only through online by using a valid Debit Card or Credit Card and online mode by visiting their student login at JSS AHER website.
2. Payments can be made online transfer or Debit Card/Credit Card by visiting JSS AHER Finance section.
3. Tuition/course fee has to be paid by own student account or parents accounts only. Third party payment can't be accepted at any stage.
4. Please note when making a payment to the JSS AHER account, the JSS AHER is not responsible for bank charges incurred. Students are only responsible for ensuring that payment is received in full as per the JSS AHER Fee Structure of the enrolled course.
5. Cash payments are not accepted for the payment of tuition fees.

Tuition fees paid by an external sponsor -

1. External Sponsored students must provide a proper documents from an 'approved external sponsor' prior to full enrolment. An approved sponsor is subject to due diligence by JSS AHER.
2. If the sponsor fails to pay any fees within 60 days of being invoiced, payment for these fees in full will become the responsibility of the sponsored student. In such cases, JSS AHER may endeavour to work with sponsored students to find a suitable payment arrangement.

Tuition fees funded through the Government support apprenticeship levy;

On payment of fees directly from the Funding Agency and/or employer, the concerned student has to follow-up with the admission / fee section concerned college/department/JSS AHER.

Tuition fees funded by Student Loans -

- If the student who has applied or is intending to apply for education loan from the relevant Finance Authority, then students must inform JSS AHER/College authorities at the time of enrolment and students are responsible for applying for their own funding directly from the relevant Student Finance Authority. The loan shall be applied annually for each year of study, in a timely manner, and for the correct course, year and fee prescribed.
- If the student funded by a Bank/Finance Authority, tuition fees shall be paid directly to JSS AHER/College Account on behalf of the student based on the engagement on or after the census date.
- Until Bank/Finance Authority agree to the terms of the loan sanctioned confirms to the JSS AHER/College, student will be solely responsible for payment of tuition fees.
- If Bank/Finance Authority fails to provide such funding, student will become responsible for paying the outstanding dues.

Roles and Responsibilities

Students are expected to-

- Pay promptly any prescribed fee determined by JSS AHER including miscellaneous fee.
- Any representation by the students regarding delay in payment of fees should be submitted to the JSS AHER at the time of joining to the course and such application should include reason/justifying the same such as application for education loan is delayed and clear mentioning the date by which fee shall be paid.

JSS AHER will -

- Provide accurate and timely information to students about the fees associated with programme of study at the JSS AHER and ensures that the students are informed of any changes since they applied for the programme and before admitting to the programme.
- Provide financial advice and guidance to students regarding payment of fees.
- Comply with relevant guidelines / orders as per the statutory/regulatory bodies with respect to fee policy.

- Charge fees in advance only for the year in which a student wants to engage to the academic activities, except to the international students where the conditions are determined by the sponsoring/funding agency with which JSS AHER has executed MoA/agreement.

The Constituent Colleges / Departments of JSSAHER shall -

- Be responsible for collection of fees by each constituent college/department of JSS AHER and shall maintain a DCB (Demand, Collection and Balance) require towards collection of fee and are required to submit the fee collection details to JSS AHER periodically.
- Notify the fee payment notification with due date on the notice board or through electronic media periodically (semester / year wise) duly marking a copy to the Finance Division of JSS AHER.
- Follow-up with the students for collection of the fees from each individual (semester / year wise) and submit the report to Finance officer within 90 days from starting of the academic year.
- Intimate the students about the fee dues in the respective semester/year. If the fee has not been paid by the students, the college/schools/ department shall submit the list of defaulters to the JSS AHER with clear recommendations for further action. Also, the college/schools/ department shall not issue “No Objection Certificate” to the students who have not paid their dues. The Head of the institution / Co-ordinator of the Department of JSSAHER will be solely responsible towards the collection of fees and adherence to the fee policy.

Refund of fee -

1. The JSS AHER follows the fee refund policy as prescribed by the statutory and regulatory bodies.
2. An application for refund of fee, on cancellation of admission on health grounds, candidate must submit handwritten/email application along with the Doctor's Certificate and / or relevant documents verifying the situation and considering the cancellation of seat and refund of fee.
3. Cancellation of admission based on seat allotment through state/central counselling authorities or direct allotment to any college or through any state/central/deemed university, within the withdrawal schedule as per statutory and regulatory bodies, will be permitted to refund of fee, as per UGC refund policy.
4. If the students have made an overpayment of fees to JSS AHER/college account, all excess payment will be refunds/returned to the candidate/student or organisation that originally made the fees payment, and back to the card or bank that the original payment was made from. There may be exceptional circumstances outside of the control that changes this requirement, and in that event, candidate shall submit the handwritten application in personal or official email to college/school/department with the required supporting documents and address identification, including a copy of the beneficiary's bank statement.

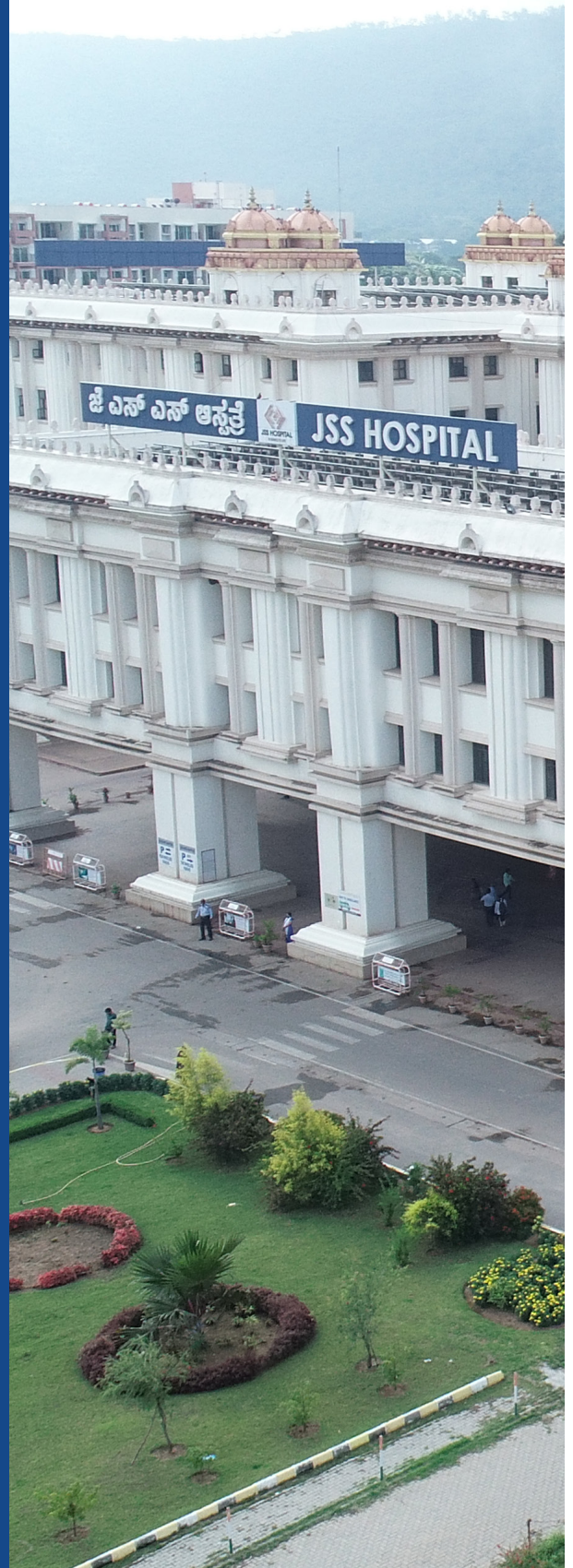

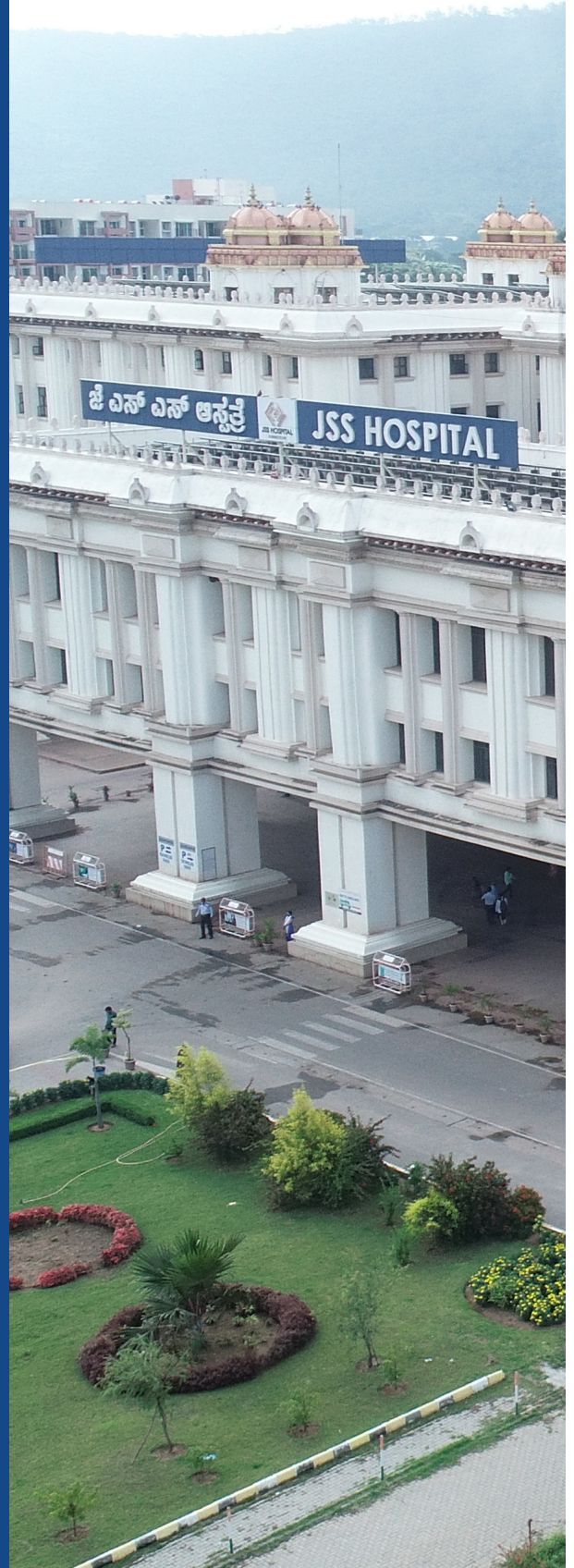

The last two years of study shall comprise of Physics, Chemistry & Biology (PCB) and must have obtained a minimum of 50% of marks taken together in PCB.

OR

Pre-Degree course from a recognized University considered as equivalent by JSS Academy of Higher Education & Research, (Two years after ten years of schooling) with Physics, Chemistry and Biology as principal subjects of study.

OR

Any equivalent examination recognized by the JSS Academy of Higher Education & Research, Mysuru for the above purpose with Physics, Chemistry and Biology as principal subjects of study.

UGC ANTI-RAGGING REGULATIONS (CLAUSES 3, 7 AND 9.1)

CLAUSE 3

What constitutes Ragging? - Ragging constitutes one or more of any of the following acts:

- a. Any conduct by any student or students whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student;
- b. Indulging in rowdy or indiscipline activities by any student or students which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship, physical or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in any fresher or any other student;
- c. Asking any student to do any act which such student will not in the ordinary course do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of such fresher or any other student;
- d. Any act by a senior student that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the regular academic activity of any other student or a fresher;
- e. Exploiting the services of a fresher or any other student for completing the academic tasks assigned to an individual or a group of students.
- f. Any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a fresher or any other student by students;
- g. Any act of physical abuse including all variants of it: sexual abuse, homosexual assaults, stripping, forcing obscene and lewd acts, gestures, causing bodily harm or any other danger to health or person;
- h. Any act or abuse by spoken words, emails, post, public insults which would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively or passively participating in the discomfiture to fresher or any other student ;
- i. Any act that affects the mental health and self-confidence of a fresher or any other student with or without an intent to derive a sadistic pleasure or showing off power, authority or superiority by a student over any fresher or any other student.

CLAUSE 7

Action to be taken by the Head of the institution - On receipt of the recommendation of the Anti-Ragging Squad or on receipt of any information concerning any reported incident of ragging, the Head of institution shall immediately determine if a case under the penal laws is made out and if so, either on his own or through a member of the Anti-Ragging Committee authorized by him in this behalf, proceed to file a First Information Report (FIR), within twenty four hours of receipt of such information or recommendation, with the police and local authorities, under the appropriate penal provisions relating to one or more of the following, namely;

- Abetment to ragging;
- Criminal conspiracy to rag;
- Unlawful assembly and rioting while ragging;
- Public nuisance created during ragging;

- Violation of decency and morals through ragging;
- Injury to body, causing hurt or grievous hurt;
- Wrongful restraint;
- Wrongful confinement;
- Use of criminal force;
- Assault as well as sexual offences or unnatural offences;
- Extortion;
- Criminal trespass;
- Offences against property;
- Criminal intimidation;
- Attempts to commit any or all of the above-mentioned offences against the victim(s);
- Threat to commit any or all of the above-mentioned offences against the victim(s);
- Physical or psychological humiliation;
- All other offences following from the definition of “Ragging”.

Provided that the Head of the institution shall forthwith report the occurrence of the incident of ragging to the District Level Anti-Ragging Committee and the Nodal officer of the affiliating University, if the institution is an affiliated institution.

Provided further that the institution shall also continue with its own enquiry initiated under clause 9 of these Regulations and other measures without waiting for action on the part of the police/local authorities and such remedial action shall be initiated and completed immediately and in no case later than a period of seven days of the reported occurrence of the incident of ragging.

CLAUSE 9.1

The institution shall punish a student found guilty of ragging after following the procedure and in the manner prescribed herein under:

- a. The Anti-Ragging Committee of the institution shall take an appropriate decision, in regard to punishment or otherwise, depending on the facts of each incident of ragging and nature and gravity of the incident of ragging established in the recommendations of the Anti-Ragging Squad.
- b. The Anti-Ragging Committee may, depending on the nature and gravity of the guilt established by the Anti-Ragging Squad, award, to those found guilty, one or more of the following punishments, namely;
 - Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges.
 - Withholding/ withdrawing scholarship/ fellowship and other benefits.
 - Debarring from appearing in any test/ examination or other evaluation process.
 - Withholding results.
 - Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival, etc.
 - Suspension/ expulsion from the hostel.
 - Cancellation of admission.

- Rustication from the institution for period ranging from one to four semesters.
 - Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution for a specified period. Provided that where the persons committing or abetting the act of ragging are not identified, the institution shall resort to collective punishment.
- c. An appeal against the order of punishment by the Anti-Ragging Committee shall lie,
- In case of an order of an institution, affiliated to or constituent part, of a University, to the Vice-Chancellor of the University;
 - In case of an order of a University, to its Chancellor.
 - In case of an institution of national importance created by an Act of Parliament, to the Chairman or Chancellor of the institution, as the case may be.

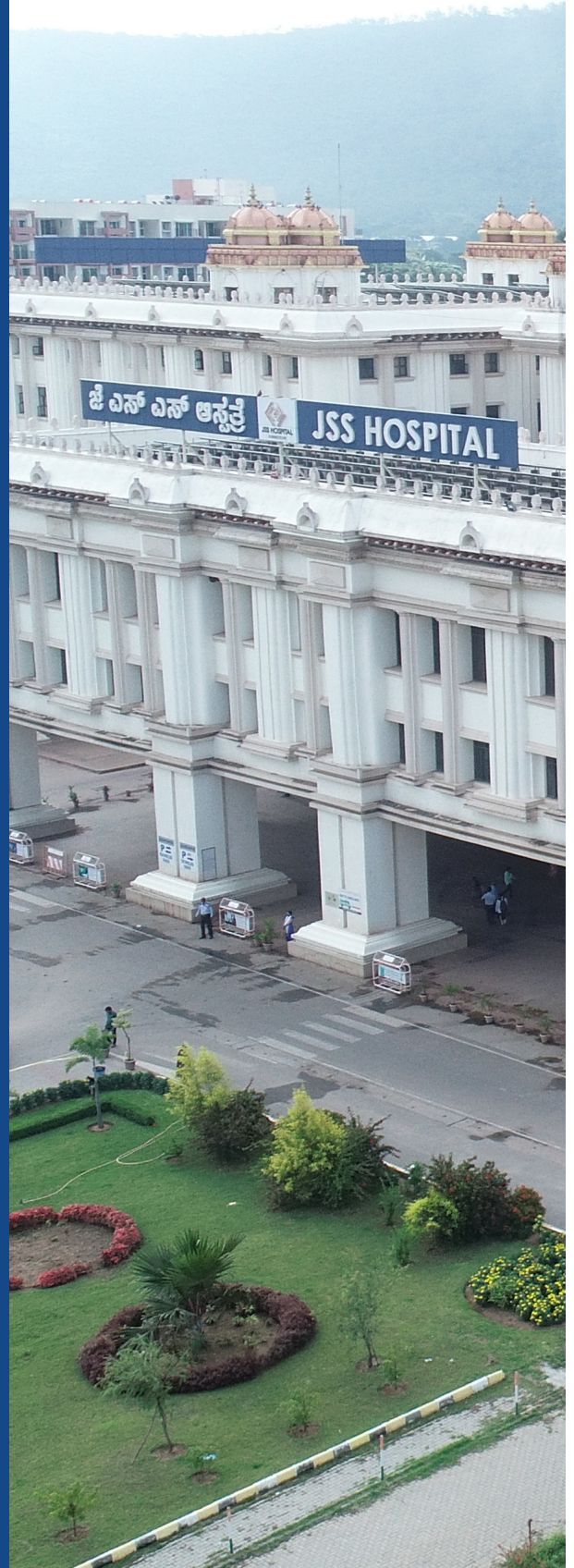

- Public health functions include: Health surveillance, monitoring and analysis, investigation of disease outbreaks & epidemics and risk to health establishing, designing and managing health promotion and disease prevention programs, enabling and empowering communities to promote health and reduce inequalities, creating and sustaining cross-Government and intersectoral partnerships to improve health workforce, ensuring the effective performance of public health services to meet goals in improving health, preventing disease and reducing inequalities, Research, development, evaluation and innovation quality assuring the public health function.
- Today most governments recognize the importance of public health programme in reducing the incidence of disease, disability, and the effects of aging, although public health generally receives significantly less government funding compared with medicine. In recent years, public health programs providing vaccinations have made incredible strides in promoting health, including the eradication of smallpox, a disease that plagued humanity for thousands of years.

Ban on Ragging

Definition

- Apart from this JSS Medical College, has joined hands with government of Karnataka in providing health care to the people in rural areas by adapting primary health centres.
- JSS Medical college encourages medical students to donate supplies / stationaries/learning resources to the kids in Anganwadi centres and primary schools as a social responsibility under medical students' social responsibility initiative.

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

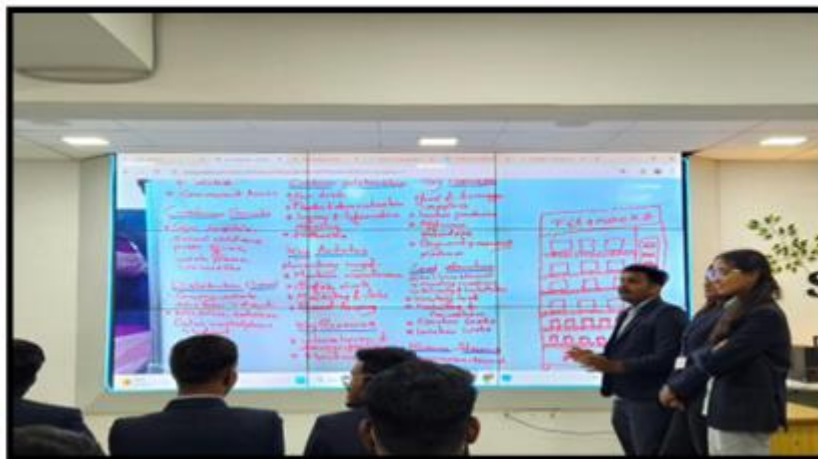

CHAPTER 3- 100% DEEMED UNIVERSITY

- ❖ There will be four rounds of counselling i.e. Round 1, Round 2, Round 3 and Stray Vacancy Round. All the 4 rounds shall be conducted online by MCC as per the directions the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India vide order dated 12.12.2022.

As per the directions of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India vide **order dated 12.12.2022** passed **I.A NO. 132614/2022 IN W.P (c) NO. 267/2017 in Dar-Us- Slam Educational Trust and Ors. vs. Medical Council of India & Ors.**,”

“2. Having heard Ms Aishwarya Bhati, Additional Solicitor General, we direct that for 100% deemed universities:

- (i) There shall be four rounds of common counselling for the All India Quota seats conducted by the Medical Counseling Committee; and*
- (ii) The Medical Counseling Committee is permitted to conduct an online counselling for the stray vacancy round.*

3. The above directions shall take effect from the ensuing academic year 2022-23.”

In light of the above directions, as passed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court, the Medical Counselling Committee (MCC) of DGHS, MoHFW, shall conduct the online counselling for the Stray Vacancy Round of 100% seats of Deemed Universities.

- ❖ All the candidates who have qualified for All India Quota seats on the basis of their rank in NEET UG conducted by NTA including candidates from Union Territory of J&K will be eligible. Eligible candidates may download the Rank letter/ Result from NTA website.

Reservation Policy:

- ❖ Candidates who fall under the category of NRI as per the directions/ orders of Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in the case (W.P. (C) No. 689/2017- Consortium of Deemed Universities in Karnataka (CODEUNIK) & Anr. Vs. Union of India &Ors.) dated 22-08-2017 are eligible for NRI Category.
- ❖ As per the directions of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India dated **03.02.2023** passed in **W.P (Civil) 891 of 2021 in the matter of 'Anushka Rengunthwar & Ors. Vs Union of India & Ors.'**,

“57. Hence, the notification being sustainable prospectively, we hereby declare that the impugned portion of the notification which provides for supersession of the notifications dated 11.04.2005, 05.01.2007 and 05.01.2009 and the clause 4(ii), its proviso and Explanation (1) thereto shall operate prospectively in respect of OCI cardholders who have secured the same subsequent to 04.03.2021.

58. We further hold that the petitioners in all these cases and all other similarly placed OCI cardholders will be entitled to the rights and privileges which had been conferred on them earlier to the notification dated 04.03.2021 and could be availed by them notwithstanding the exclusion carved out in the notification dated 04.03.2021. The participation of the petitioners and similarly placed OCI cardholders in the selection process and the subsequent action based on 74 the interim orders passed herein or elsewhere shall stand regularized.”

- ❖ Keeping in view of the directions passed hereinabove, the OCI cardholders will now be eligible to the rights which were provided to them earlier to the impugned notification dated 04.03.2021. They will be treated at par with Indian citizens and will be eligible for UR (General) category seats as well as NRI seats for the purpose of NEET(UG)-2023 for counselling conducted by MCC.

The Candidates who wish to claim the benefit under NRI category through NRI sponsorship will have to submit the following documents as and when the same are called for by the MCC along with the undertaking as annexed as **Annexure 6**.

- Documents claiming that the sponsorer is an NRI (Passport, Visa of the sponsorer).
- Relationship of NRI with the candidate as per the court orders of The Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in case W.P.(c) No. 689/2017- Consortium of Deemed Universities in Karnataka (CODEUNIK) & Ans. Vs Union of India & Ors. dated 22-08- 2017.
- Affidavit from the sponsorer that he/ she will sponsor the entire course fee of the candidate duly notarized.
- Embassy Certificate of the Sponsorer (Certificate from the Consulate).
- NEET Score Card of the candidate.

There will be no reservation for OBC/ SC/ ST/ PWD/EWS candidates in Deemed Universities.

There might be reservation for Jain Minority or Muslim Minority in certain Deemed universities. Candidates are requested to verify their eligibility for the same before applying under the said category.

Seat Matrix:

- The seat matrix for the Deemed University seats shall be prepared by the MCC of DGHS, MoHFW.

Eligibility Condition for Deemed University:

1. The Candidate should have qualified NEET UG.
2. Domicile free.

JAIN MINORITY/ MUSLIM MINORITY/ NRI CONVERSION: JAIN MINORITY/ MUSLIM MINORITY/ NRI seats remaining vacant during the Round 3 will be converted to Private Deemed University seats after exhaustion of all the eligible Jain Minority/Muslim Minority/ NRI candidates to avoid any wastage of seats.

- ❖ The conversion of seats will be carried out during the Round 3 of Deemed Universities. The said conversion will be done only when the eligible Candidates belonging to the said Conversion Category have exhausted.

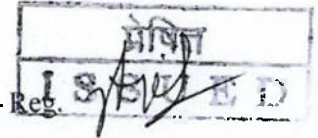

Subject: Implementation of Reservation Policy of the Government of India –



Sir/Madam,

With reference to the above subject, I am to inform that for implementation of reservation policy of the Central Government, MHRD vide order No. 6-30/2005-U5 dated 6th December, 2005 directed the UGC to ensure effective implementation of the reservation policy in the Central Universities and those of Institutions Deemed to be Universities receiving aid from the public funds except in minority institutions under Article 30(1) of the Constitution. Accordingly, UGC, vide letter No. 1-5/2006(SCT) dated 25-08-2006, circulated new Guidelines for strict implementation of Reservation Policy of the Government. This has been further reiterated by MHRD O.M.No. 12-60/2013-U1 dated 25-6-2013.

The Ministry of Human Resource Development vide its letter No. 1-7/2017-CU.V dated 06-09-2017 has directed the UGC to examine the issues mentioned in judgments (10 in number) as quoted by the Hon'ble High Court of Allahabad, in its order dated 07-04-2017 and submit its recommendations to MHRD for their consideration and appropriate decision.

Accordingly, UGC had constituted a Committee and submitted its recommendations to Ministry of Human Resource Development on 07-11-2017. Thereafter, in compliance of the judgement of the Allahabad High Court as upheld by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India and in view of advice tendered by the DoPT and recommendations of the UGC, MHRD vide its

O.M. No.1-7/2017-CU.V dated 22-02-2018; has intimated that the department's O.M.No.12-60/2013-U1 dated 25.06.2013 stands amended to the extent as mentioned below in the UGC guidelines 2006, in accordance with the recommendations of the UGC, which are as under:

“(i) Clause 6(c):

In case of reservation for SC/ST, all the Universities, Deemed to be Universities, Colleges and other Grant-in-Aid Institutions and Centres shall prepare the roster system keeping the Department / Subject as a unit for all levels of teachers as applicable.

(ii) Clause 8(a)(v):





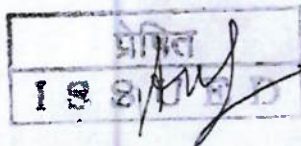

Sir,

In continuation to this office letter No.F.21-2/2015 (CU) dated 23.03.2016 (copy enclosed) regarding the policy of reservation in admissions and appointments, I am directed to inform you to implement the reservation policy in admissions and appointments as under :-

- (i) **University may follow the reservation policy in admissions** in all courses as per provisions contained in the Central Educational Institutions (Reservation in Admission) Act, 2006 (Gazette notification dated 04.01.2007) and as amended in 2012 (Gazette notification dated 20.06.2012). A copy of each of the CEI Act 2006 and Amendment Act, 2012 is enclosed for ready reference.
- (ii) For reservation policy in appointments of Non-Teaching staff, university may follow the quantum of reservation in Group 'C' and erstwhile Group 'D' posts as per instructions issued by DoPT Order No.36011/6/2010-Estt.(Res.) dated 25th June, 2010 (copy enclosed). For reservation in Group 'A' and Group 'B' posts, the reservation for SC is 15%, for ST is 7.5% and for OBC, reservation in direct recruitment is 27%.
- (iii) In teaching positions, reservation for SC is 15% and for ST is 7.5% at all three levels i.e. Professor, Associate Professor and Assistant Professor. However, 27% OBC reservation in teaching positions is applicable at the level of Assistant Professor only.

Sir,

This is in reference to the discussion on Revised Budget Estimates for 2015-2016 held on 1st March, 2016 to 3rd March, 2016 in the UGC office. In this regard, I am directed to inform you that It has been observed that some of the Central Universities has not maintained the point wise reservation roster. Therefore, it is to inform you to frame the point wise reservation roster as per rules framed by the Govt. of India. Further, it is also to inform you that as per instructions of Govt. of India/UGC, the educational institutions receiving grant-in-aid from Central Government have to follow the prescribed percentage of Reservation i.e. 15% for SCs, 7½% for STs and 27% in OBCs in the matter of teaching and non-teaching posts as well as in admissions to various courses except Minority educational institutions under Article 30(1) of the Constitution. The Central Universities are receiving 100% grant from the Central Government/UGC and they have to follow the Reservation Policy of the Government of India for SCs/STs in toto i.e. 15% for SCs, 7½% for STs and 27% for OBCs in the matter of teaching and non-teaching posts as well as in admissions to various courses/degrees.

As per instructions of UGC, all the Central Universities have to maintain/provide the reservation for SCs/STs in teaching positions at all levels i.e. Assistant Professor, Associate Professor and Professor and OBC reservation at Assistant Professor only.

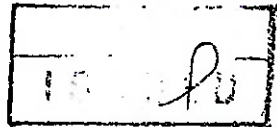

The following Act of Parliament received the assent of the President on the 3rd January, 2007, and is hereby published for general information:—

THE CENTRAL EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS (RESERVATION IN ADMISSION) ACT, 2006

No. 5 of 2007

[3rd January, 2007.]

An Act to provide for the reservation in admission of the students belonging to the Scheduled Castes, the Scheduled Tribes and the Other Backward Classes of citizens, to certain Central Educational Institutions established, maintained or aided by the Central Government, and for matters connected therewith or incidental thereto.

BE it enacted by Parliament in the Fifty-seventh Year of the Republic of India as follows:—

1. This Act may be called the Central Educational Institutions (Reservation in Admission) Act, 2006. Short title.

2. In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires,—

Definitions.

(a) “academic session” means the period in a calendar year, or a part thereof, during which a Central Educational Institution is open for teaching or instruction in any branch of study or faculty;

(b) "annual permitted strength" means the number of seats, in a course or programme for teaching or instruction in each branch of study or faculty authorised by an appropriate authority for admission of students to a Central Educational Institution;

(c) "appropriate authority" means the University Grants Commission, the Bar Council of India, the Medical Council of India, the All India Council for Technical Education or any other authority or body established by or under a Central Act for the determination, co-ordination or maintenance of the standards of higher education in any Central Educational Institution;

(d) "Central Educational Institution" means—

(i) a university established or incorporated by or under a Central Act;

(ii) an institution of national importance set up by an Act of Parliament;

(iii) an institution, declared as a deemed University under section 3 of the University Grants Commission Act, 1956, and maintained by or receiving aid from the Central Government;

(iv) an institution maintained by or receiving aid from the Central Government, whether directly or indirectly, and affiliated to an institution referred to in clause (i) or clause (ii), or a constituent unit of an institution referred to in clause (ii);

(v) an educational institution set up by the Central Government under the Societies Registration Act, 1860;

21 of 1860.

(e) "faculty" means the faculty of a Central Educational Institution;

(f) "Minority Educational Institution" means an institution established and administered by the minorities under clause (1) of article 30 of the Constitution and so declared by an Act of Parliament or by the Central Government or declared as a Minority Educational Institution under the National Commission for Minority Educational Institutions Act, 2004;

(g) "Other Backward Classes" means the class or classes of citizens who are socially and educationally backward, and are so determined by the Central Government;

(h) "Scheduled Castes" means the Scheduled Castes notified under article 341 of the Constitution;

(i) "Scheduled Tribes" means the Scheduled Tribes notified under article 342 of the Constitution;

(j) "teaching or instruction in any branch of study" means teaching or instruction in a branch of study leading to three principal levels of qualifications at bachelor (undergraduate) masters (postgraduate) and doctoral levels.

3. The reservation of seats in admission and its extent in a Central Educational Institution shall be provided in the following manner, namely:—

(i) out of the annual permitted strength in each branch of study or faculty, fifteen per cent. seats shall be reserved for the Scheduled Castes;

(ii) out of the annual permitted strength in each branch of study or faculty, seven and one-half per cent. seats shall be reserved for the Scheduled Tribes;

(iii) out of the annual permitted strength in each branch of study or faculty, twenty-seven per cent. seats shall be reserved for the Other Backward Classes.

4. The provisions of section 3 of this Act shall not apply to

Act not to apply in certain cases

(a) a Central Educational Institution established in the tribal areas referred to in the Sixth Schedule to the Constitution;

(b) the institutions of excellence, research institutions, institutions of national and strategic importance specified in the Schedule to this Act;

Provided that the Central Government may, as and when considered necessary, by notification in the Official Gazette, amend the Schedule;

(c) a Minority Educational Institution as defined in this Act;

(d) a course or programme at high levels of specialisation, including at the post-doctoral level, within any branch of study or faculty, which the Central Government may, in consultation with the appropriate authority, specify.

5. (1) Notwithstanding anything contained in clause (iii) of section 3 and in any other law for the time being in force, every Central Educational Institution shall, with the prior approval of the appropriate authority, increase the number of seats in a branch of study or faculty over and above its annual permitted strength so that the number of seats, excluding those reserved for the persons belonging to the Scheduled Castes, the Scheduled Tribes and the Other Backward Classes, is not less than the number of such seats available for the academic session immediately preceding the date of the coming into force of this Act.

Mandatory increase of seats.

(2) Where, on a representation by any Central Educational Institution, the Central Government, in consultation with the appropriate authority, is satisfied that for reasons of financial, physical or academic limitations or in order to maintain the standards of education, the annual permitted strength in any branch of study or faculty of such institution cannot be increased for the academic session following the commencement of this Act, it may permit by notification in the Official Gazette, such institution to increase the annual permitted strength over a maximum period of three years beginning with the academic session following the commencement of this Act; and then, the extent of reservation for the Other Backward Classes as provided in clause (iii) of section 3 shall be limited for that academic session in such manner that the number of seats available to the Other Backward Classes for each academic session are commensurate with the increase in the permitted strength for each year.

6. The Central Educational Institutions shall take all necessary steps, which are required in giving effect to the provisions of sections 3, 4 and 5 of this Act, for the purposes of reservation of seats in admissions to its academic sessions commencing on and from the calendar year, 2007.

Reservation of seats in admissions to begin in calendar year, 2007.

7. Every notification made under this Act shall be laid, as soon as may be after it is made, before each House of Parliament while it is in session, for a total period of thirty days which may be comprised in one session or in two or more successive sessions, and if, before the expiry of the session immediately following the session or the successive sessions aforesaid, both Houses agree in making any modification in the notification or both Houses agree that the notification should not be made, the notification shall thereafter have effect only in such modified form or be of no effect, as the case may be; so, however, that any such modification or annulment shall be without prejudice to the validity of anything previously done under that notification.
