

#### Status in India


- 65.46% of the women are literate as compared to 82.14% of Men.
- Enrolment of Girls in primary education is 100% but 74.6% women are not enrolled in higher education
- Women hold only 11% of seats in Lok Sabha but in Panchayati raj institutions it is 46%.
- Child sex ratio is 919 girls for 1000 boys.
- 48.5% population are women but only 27.4% of women are in workforce.

The Institution has been supporting educational needs of girl students from different sectors without any discrimination thus "Empowering women through education". The policies of the institute have been very well received by the public, which has given them the trust to allow their wards, especially those belonging to minority communities and particularly girl students to be admitted to basic and higher studies.



#### Healthy gender ratio adequately maintained in the Institution


No of Male and female students of JSS Medical College

## Internal Complaints Committee on Sexual Harassment of women at workplace (Women's Grievance Redressal Cell)

#### 1. Objective of Women's Grievance Redressal Cell

- The cell deals with the cases/ complaints of sexual harassment and any other type of harassment of the female students, teaching and non-teaching women staff of the college
- 4 The cell shall process all the individual complaints and take immediate suitable action
- The cell will provide assistance to the faculty / colleges for taking preventive steps in the matter of gender discrimination and sexual harassment.
- + The principal will be the chairman of the cell and may appoint members of the cell
- + The cell may form / review the guidelines /policy for redressal of the grievances as required from

time to time, which may be in accordance with those issued by Supreme Court and Government Agencies

#### 2. Grievance Procedure

- Any women employee / female student will have the right to lodge a complaint concerning sexual harassment against a male student or the employee of the institute by writing a letter or putting the complaint in the Principals Office the complaints will be afforded with full confidentiality after receiving the complaint the chairman shall convene the meeting of the cell
- The chairman will appoint investigation committee. coordinator will convene the meetings the investigation committee shall then decide the course of action to proceed
- The complaint will stand dropped if in accordance to the committee the complaint has not been able to disclose prima-facie an offence of sexual harassment by the complainer/ her representative in case the investigation committee decides to proceed with the complaint, the wishes of the complainer shall be ascertained and if the complainer wishes that a warning will suffice then alleged offender shall be called to the meeting of the committee heard and if satisfied that a warning is just and proper, he will be warned about his behavior and nonoccurrence of it. in case the complainer requests that the complaint should proceeded with beyond mere a warning, the same may be proceed with in the manner prescribed hereafter

#### 3. Procedure for investigation

- The complainer wishes proved beyond way the wound, the ed thall be in writing by the west committee an opposite to within week he should not be iw and me punished f the wd harassment on his part.
- The written explanation of the ot found to be satisfactory o if he dies provide any written explanation, the investigation in will decide whether the offense deserves a minor penalty or a major penalty
- In the event that the investigation committee deciding that the accused be imposed a minor penalty, the said penalty will be recommended by the investigation committee the chairman of the cell for decision
- If the investigation committee comes to come to a conclusion that the accused in case if his guilt proved, should be imposed a major penalty, it shall make a recommendation of action. If the accused is an employee, he may be placed under suspension under the provisions of act
- If a person is charged with physical molestation or rape on college / society's is shall be immediately placed under suspension pending the completion of the dentition and enquiry appropriate actions can be initiated as per the laws of Indian penal code.

#### 4. Punishment for sexual harassment

- Any member of the institute fraternity (student/employee/outsider related to institute) found guilty of sexual harassment shall be liable to be punished. This shall be subject to the same penalty for major or minor misconduct as prescribed under government/ university rules.
- **4** A student guilty of sexual harassment shall be liable for any of the following penalties:
  - Warning or reprimand.
  - Suspension from University College for a period of one month.
  - Debarment from appearing for the examination for a period up to three years
  - Rutication from the university as the case may be
  - Any other punishment an defined by the government /university act

#### 5. Protection against Victimization

- The committee noted ant approved the policy on Protection against Victimization of the Women Grievance Redressal Cell as following
- In the event of the complainant being a student and the accused being teacher during the pendency of the investigation and inquiry and even after such enquiry if the teacher is found to be guilty, the accused will not act as an examiner for any examination for which the student appears
- In the event the complainer and the accused both being employees, during the pendency of the investigation and inquiry even after such an enquiry if the accused is found to be guilty, the accused shall not write the condition report of the complainer, it is otherwise so authorized.

# LECTURE ON GENDER HARASSMENT AND ITS CONSEQUENCES FOR COLLEGE STUDENTS



**Dr. Vidya C S** Professor and Head, Department of Anatomy, JSS Medical College delivered lecture on the topic "Awareness on Gender Harassment and its consequences for the college students on 30<sup>th</sup> of February 2024 Verbal examples of sexual harassment may include making sexual comments about a person's body, making sexual comments or innuendos, asking personal questions about someone's social life, making sexual comments about a person's clothing.

**Examples of non-verbal harassment** include looking a person up and down ('elevator eyes'), following or stalking someone, using sexually suggestive visuals, making sexual gestures with the hands or through body movements, using facial expressions such as winking.

**Instances of physical harassment** include giving someone a massage around the neck or shoulders, touching another person's clothing, hair, or body, hugging, kissing, patting, touching or rubbing oneself sexually against another person. The key concept in understanding harassment is that **any overtures are unwelcome**. Session emphasized on punishments, measures taken at JSSAHER and rules to curb gender harassment.

#### 4) Report of World Kidney Day 2024- Screening and Health Awareness Program on 14.3.2024

The department of Pharmacy practice jointly with IPA Nilgiris local branch, Rotary Club Nilgiris West, Rotaract Club of JSSCP, and Govt. Medical College and hospital, Ooty organized a Kidney awareness program at the IOB, Commercial Road, Ooty, The Nilgiris. The program was sponsored by JSSAHER, Mysuru, and aimed to raise awareness about kidney risk factors, and the importance of early diagnosis, screening, treatment, and prevention of Kidney diseases among the public & customers of IOB. A total of 7 volunteers from IV PharmD and Ph.D. Scholars were actively involved in the health screening activities of the program, 5 faculty members delivered their counseling addressing each topic related to kidney. The event was inaugurated by Dr Dhanabal SP, Principal, Mr. Mishra Branch Manager, IOB, Ooty. The program began with distributing pamphlets by the bank manager and the principal. The students counseled the public on the unusual symptoms of kidney diseases when should they go to a physician for a check-up, and the importance of regular screening for the prevention of kidney diseases.

In this health screening camp, about 113 patients benefitted. Blood pressure was monitored using an electronic sphygmomanometer, Blood glucose was measured using a Glucometer, and Body mass index was calculated by measuring the patient's height and weight to determine whether the patient was underweight, healthy weight, overweight, or obese. Patient counseling was given to the participants according to the screening results and Patient information pamphlets were distributed to all the participants to develop awareness among the local people regarding kidney disease. The questionnaire was provided to participants to understand their knowledge about the disease Faculty from Govt. Medical College and Hospital collected the blood sample and did the Renal function test. Awareness videos are also projected in the screening about the kidney functions and kidney diseases.

Dr Deepalakshmi M, Assistant Professor JSSCP, Ooty the co-ordinator of the program highlighted the importance of Kidney awareness.



The workshop was relayed from the major OT to the auditorium by a well-organized audiovisual team. Several interesting cases, around six cases were demonstrated by our resource person in live. Various cases were chaired by renowned gynecologists to make an effective communication between the audience and the operating team. 
