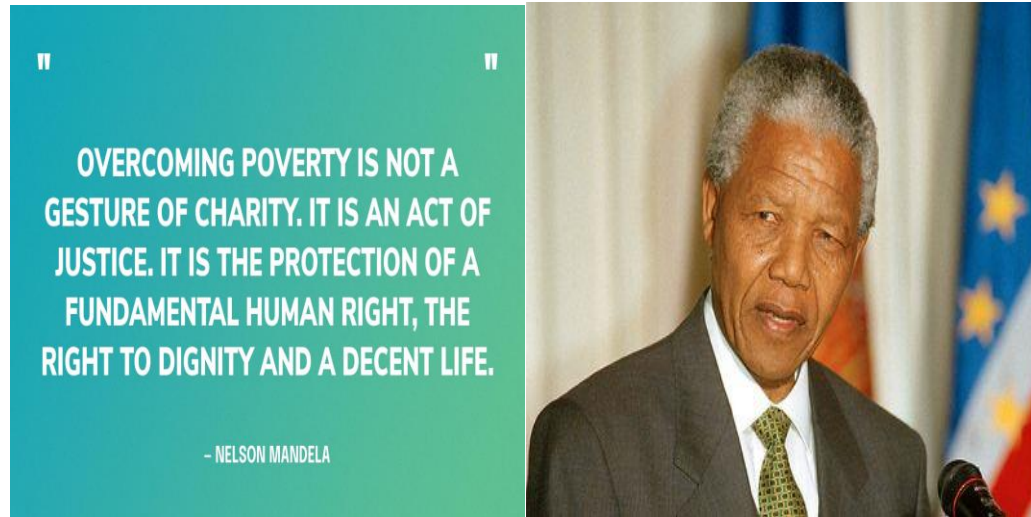

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## ABOUT THE SDG 1



The Sustainable Development Goal (SDG) pertaining to poverty is dedicated to the complete elimination of poverty, with the overarching objective of ensuring that every individual, regardless of their geographical location or personal circumstances, can lead a life characterized by dignity and opportunities. ***This goal is encapsulated in the powerful statement: "End poverty in all its manifestations, everywhere." It is an integral component of the United Nations' 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development, which was adopted in September 2015.***

Extreme poverty, as per this SDG, is defined as the condition where individuals subsist on an income of less than \$1.90 per day. This multifaceted perspective on poverty encompasses various dimensions, including income levels, access to fundamental services, educational opportunities, and healthcare access. The goal endeavors to establish robust social protection systems designed to assist vulnerable individuals and families in breaking free from the vicious cycle of poverty. Furthermore, it underscores the importance of fostering resilience against a range of challenges, spanning economic volatility, environmental upheavals, and other unforeseen circumstances that may precipitate poverty.

The attainment of this objective necessitates a collaborative approach, encouraging governments, businesses, and civil society to unite in a global partnership for sustainable development. As per the directions of Hon'ble Supreme Court of India and regulations framed under the Indian Medical Council Act-1956 as amended in 2016 and the Dentists Act-1948 as amended in 2016, National Testing Agency (NTA) conducts the National Eligibility-cumEntrance Test– (NEET - UG) for admission to Undergraduate Medical (MBBS) Courses. The National Board of Examination (NBE) conducts the National Eligibility-cum-Entrance Test (NEET-UG/PG) for admission to Post Graduate MD/MS/PG Diploma Courses in terms of Section (10) of the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956 as amended in 2016. Directorate General of health Services, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare has been entrusted the responsibility to hold online common counseling for All India Quota seats (including NRI quota) for admission to Undergraduate & Post-Graduate Medical courses. Admission / Reporting at JSS Medical & Dental Colleges of JSS AHER will be done based on the guidelines & Schedule of MCC of DGHS, issued from time to time.

### **Postgraduate Medicine & Dentistry**

As per the directions of Hon'ble Supreme Court of India and regulations framed under the Indian Medical Council Act-1956 as amended in 2016 and the Dentists Act-1948 as amended in 2016, National Testing Agency (NTA) conducts the National Eligibility-cumEntrance Test– (NEET - UG) for admission to UndergraduateDental (BDS) Courses. In compliance of Hon'ble Supreme Court's directions in WP 267 of 2017 DAR-US-SALAM EDUCATIONAL TRUST AND ORS Petitioner(s) VERSUS MEDICAL COUNCIL OF INDIA AND ORS, the court has directed that Common Counseling for admission to All India Quota seats in Government Medical Colleges shall be conducted by the DGHS. The counseling conducted by DGHS will also include Deemed-to-Universities as they have an All India character. The Deemed-to-Universities also includes Deemed-to-Universities run by religious and linguistic minorities.

Admission notification will be released through print media and in the JSS AHER website JSS AHER calendar of events is drawn based on the 10+2 results The applications will be invited from eligible candidates The seats are allotted as per the inter-se merit in the qualifying Exam/degree. PG Admission notification will be released through print media and in the JSS AHER website. 2 session shall be conducted every year (January & July) JSS AHER calendar of events is drawn based on the UG results The applications will be invited from eligible candidates The seats are allotted as per the inter-se merit in the qualifying degree.

## Primary Preventive Oral Health Education Program at Residential School Suttur

The program consisted of an oral health education lecture for 1st and 2nd standard children at JSS Free Residential School Sutter. Children, Teachers, and Hostel caretakers were educated on the proper brushing technique, use of appropriate size toothbrush for the relevant age, routine 3 monthly disposals of the used toothbrush, the appropriate amount of toothpaste use, and appropriate frequency of brushing with time by Paediatric dentist and Hygienist team from JSS Dental College and Hospital, Mysuru and low fluoride toothpaste specific for the age group were distributed to the 169 children with support from the Group Pharmaceuticals. The children were given an Audiovisual simulator model demonstration for the correct method of children brushing in easily understandable language. Children also were supplied with an age-appropriate oral hygiene kit sponsored by Group Pharmaceuticals.

To practice, a proper brushing technique child has to remember sixteen different anatomical positions which are difficult. Recent studies have reported that it is very difficult to find a correct method of brushing on social

media for both adults and children. So with experience and research Department of pediatrics and preventive dentistry of the Faculty of dentistry constituent colleges of JagathguruSriShivarathreeshwara University has designed a novel brushing method for children based on the sequence learning principle. This method of brushing already is in practice by all grade children of Suttur Free School and was found very effective. Training of school teachers on Primary preventive oral health measures Oral health education through Teachers. Also, the teachers of schools were provided with teaching material containing booklets in which the tooth decay process, diet, and its importance, preventive protocols, and oral hygiene measures were explained in simple equation format and a story format so that teachers will further educate and reinforce the children regarding oral health even in absence of oral care providers. The program started on the first Friday of August 2022 and progressed every Friday and was completed on the Third Friday of September 2022. This education program was headed by Dr.Nandlal.B (Prof), Dr.Raghavendra Shanbhog (Reader), Dr. Brinda Godhi (Reader)Mr.Mahendra(Oral Hygienist).

### **Oral Hygiene instructions programme and Distribution of oral hygiene kits**

As An outreach Program of Dept of Pediatric & Preventive Dentistry, JSS Dental College & Hospital, and as part of special activity under corporate social responsibility has been annually conducting Primary and Preventive Oral Health Education program to the children of Sri Sairanga School for Speech and Hearing Impairment, Mysuru. The School consisting of total of 117 children in the current academic year 2022-23 were reoriented to adopt and carry out the oral hygiene measures on 01-09-2022. As a part of this program Group Pharmaceutical Ltd joined hands with JSS Dental College and Hospital, by providing oral hygiene kits which was distributed to all the children of Sri Sairanga School for Speech and Hearing Impairment, Mysuru

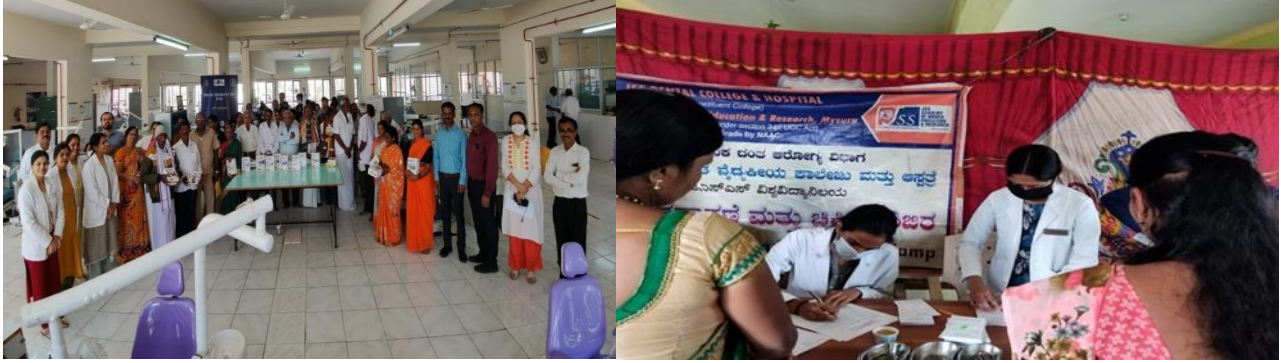

## **National oral health program(NOHP)**

Karnataka State Government, Health and Family welfare department, Mother and Child Hospital, Nanjangudu taluk, Mysore District organized an activity to observe World Oral Health Day in line with guidelines of the National oral health program(NOHP) and association with Dept of Pediatric and Preventive Dentistry, JSS Dental College and Hospital, JSSAHER, Mysore on 19-4-2023 to create the awareness on mother and child oral health for Nursing officers and ASHA workers. Early childhood caries is a serious public health concern with far-reaching social and economic consequences. There has been a rapid increase in the prevalence of primary tooth decay especially in low- & middle-income countries. The existing public health care system in India is a unique, hierarchical structure whose heart and soul lie in the hands of community health workers (auxiliary nurse midwives, Anganwadi workers, and ASHA) These workers are tailored to meet the unique needs of the communities they serve. This program was conducted to train a nuclear group of community health workers in association with MCH. Since these health workers are the first point of contact for both expectant mothers and children in the rural population.

The program was inaugurated by Dr. Shivprasad, AMO, Nanjangudu General Hospital, Dr. S Anitha, NOHP, Nodal Officer Mysore District, Dr. Uma, Dr. Veena Singh, Gynaecologist, MCH Hospital, Jayamala Paediatrician and Dr. Nandlal B, Prof & Head, Department of Pediatric Dentistry, JSSDCH. The program followed with the release of the booklet by Dr Shivprasad which had information on the importance of mother and child oral health. Dr. B Nandlal briefed about the objective of the program and the importance of educating Community health workers and in turn how they can educate expectant mothers and how they can bring the overall change in the society. Further Dr B Nandlal advised that school authorities should advice parents to discourage to carry sweet containing snacks like cream biscuits, cakes and jam etc. in school snacks boxes of children as they due to its retentive nature on teeth may cause more chances for dental decay. The program ended with a interactive discussion with children to report to the JSS Dental college and Hospital for further advice and care through the Pediatric dentists.

## SPECIAL SMILES ORAL CARE CLINIC AT THE DEPARTMENT OF PEDIATRICS, JSS HOSPITAL



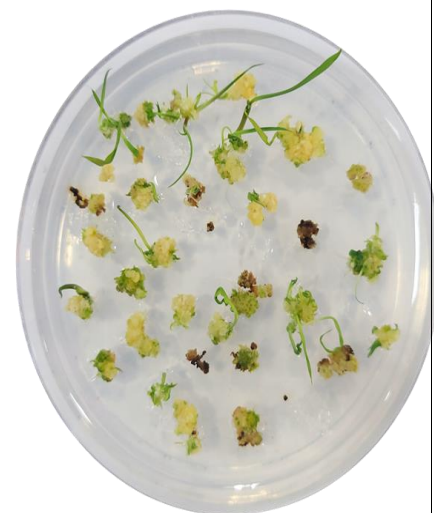

### **FREE MID-DAY MEALS TO PRIMARY AND HIGH SCHOOL CHILDREN FROM RURAL AREAS**

JSS Maha Vidya Peetha Akshara Dasoha Yojane, in collaboration with the Government of Karnataka, initiated the provision of free mid-day meals to primary and high school children from rural areas. Under this scheme, the institution effectively implements the distribution of meals in more than 33 villages in Karnataka. Currently, over 12,000 children benefit from the Akshara Dasoha scheme. The institution supplies the food from its central kitchen. To address the poor health and learning abilities resulting from inadequate nutrition among economically backward and underprivileged children, JSSMVP decided to provide free mid-day meals to children studying in rural schools. This initiative aims to improve attendance and retention rates among children enrolled in rural schools, supporting educational objectives and promoting social equity. JSS ensures that their staffs maintain high hygiene levels. They clean the vegetables and food grains before cooking, utilizing pure water for the cooking process. The central kitchen is well-maintained, and the utensils are cleaned daily before cooking and after serving the food. Currently, the project actively extends its coverage to schools located in Yelandur, a disadvantaged taluk in the Chamarajanagara district, and schools in the Mysuru district. JSS takes the responsibility of bearing the expenses that go beyond the grants provided by the government.

JSS Karnataka Open School (JSS KOS), the brainchild of Karnataka Higher Secondary Education, plays a pivotal role in the promotion and development of an open and distance learning system in the State of Karnataka. JSSKOS functioning under JSS Mahavidyapeetha, Mysore, was established in the year 1999-2000 to bring school dropouts and those who were deprived of formal education, to the mainstream of education. With the guidance of the National Institute of Open Schooling, NOIDA, the school provides education for those who are unable to get a formal school education. Karnataka Secondary Education Examination Board (KSEEB) will be conducting examinations and issuing marks cards to the students. The Personal Contact Programme (PCPs) classes conducted by Karnataka Open School are equivalent to regular SSLC. It started with 8 centres and now it has more than 100 study centres all over Karnataka State and more than 3000 students are pursuing their studies in these centres every year. Each state in India has its own state open school which is being run by the respective governments but in Karnataka, the responsibility of running this school is entrusted to JSS Mahavidyapeetha, Mysuru. His Holiness Jagadguru Sri Shivarathri Deshikendra Mahaswamiji is the chairman of the Karnataka Open School.

JSS Basic Training Institute, is one of the oldest and most important institutes. As a result, three teacher training institutes were opened, making teaching education easily accessible to rural students. The institute is first of its kind in the entire southern India imparting training in Jewellery Designing and Manufacturing to the Goldsmiths, Artisans and trading community in gems and jewellery sector. The Centre there by creating facility to provide modern approach for ancient Indian Jewellery making techniques and also to promote use of modern scientific techniques and introduce them to the rural goldsmiths.

## **JSS Rural Development & Self Employment Training Institute**

In India, thousands of rural youth are facing the problems of unemployment due to varied reasons like lack of access to technology, higher education, financial resources etc. Addressing the issue, JSSMVP, in association with the State Bank of Mysore, and the Dept. of Industries and Commerce, Govt. of Karnataka, is running a Rural Development and Self Employment Training Centre (RUDSETI) in Chamarajanagar.

One unique aspect at RUDSETI is that it offers post-training support to its candidates to help them overcome the hurdles of self-employment. RUDSETI believes in motivating the youth by imparting proper training through constant support

RUDSETI was established by JSSMVP to transform unemployed youth into useful, productive and self-reliant entrepreneurs. RUDSETI has a 9.5-acre campus, four production cum training centres and residential facility to accommodate 80-100 persons. Since its inception, RUDSETI, is virtually brewing a silent revolution of sorts in the Backward District of Chamarajanagar in Karnataka. The centre has the know-how to identify potential areas of employment and local talent to establish and manage production centres.

### **Objectives of RUDSETI:**

1. Empower rural youth and economically backward sections leading to the development of rural enterprises and entrepreneurship.
2. Identify, orient, motivate, train and assist rural youth including tribal communities to attain sustainability and economic well being through rural entrepreneurship.
3. Upgrade technical, agricultural, managerial and service delivery skills.
4. Promote and train self-help groups.
5. Identify, develop and transfer appropriate and sustainable rural technologies.
6. Personality development for school and college students.
7. Promote awareness and trigger use of non-conventional and energy efficient technologies

### **Programmes offered at RUDSETI:**

- **Training-cum-Production Centers**

Chamarajanagar, being one of the most backward districts of the southern region had no industrial culture during early 2000. Efforts were needed to bring in an industrial culture through infusing few industrial activities in the city of Chamrajnagar. JSS RUDSETI took this initiative of luring some of the industrialist/entrepreneurs to start their activity through joint effort which resulted in the emerging of Training Cum Production Centers. The institution has set up the following Training Cum Production Centers which has started slowly changing the work culture of the people.

- **Modern Craft Training Cum Production Centre**

JSS RUDSETI has entered into an MOU with M/s AEC Offshore trading Private Limited, an Australian based company. After procuring orders, handicraft items are prepared and sent to various countries of Europe and Australia. This has provided employment opportunities for more than 250 rural unemployed women round the year. The institute has set up satellite centers in the adjoining blocks of villages at Harave and Thalavadi.

- **Training Cum Production Centre in the area of Electronic Art Manufacturing**

Observing the continuous demand for graphic designs in Advertising agencies, a state of art facility has been set up in collaboration with Adwit Global India Ltd,. Bangalore to train and employ 100 rural literate youths. In this direction, nearly 80 candidates have been trained of which 21 candidates are provided with employment and 21 candidates are undergoing 3 months training programme at the centre.

- **Bamboo Manufacturing**

With the financial support from Vishveshvaraiah Industrial Trade Centre(VITC), Government of Karnataka, the Institute has established a facility to take up training and manufacturing of Bamboo-based products. At Present we are producing the sample sticks which are using for Agarabatthi making.

## Jan Shikshan Sansthan

### **Skill upgradation programme for socio-economically backward and educationally disadvantaged groups in the society**

Jan Shikshan Sansthan conducts skill upgradation programme. It offers training in a non-formal mode in rural and urban slums of a district. The institute provides academic and technical support to the target group. The socio-economically backward and educationally disadvantaged groups in the society are still facing problems in getting a good job. The reason being, lack of access to financial resources and formal education. The Department of School of Education and Literacy, Govt. of India, under the Ministry of Human Resource Development, sponsors Jan Shikshan Sansthan. The erstwhile name of this institution was Shramik Vidyapeeth. As a result of the cabinet decision taken during the year 1999, these institutions throughout India are categorized as Jan Shikshan Sansthan.

**Purpose:**JSSMVP, a pioneer in providing general education to both rural and urban population, decided to join hands with the nation to address the issues of unemployment and JSS Jan Shikshan Sansthan was established on April 1, 1986, in Mysore by JSSMVP. It conducts various types of need-based skill training programmes and general awareness programmes. The beneficiaries are illiterate youths, neo-literates, house-wives, school-dropouts and unemployed youth who do not have formal education facilities. The vocational training offered by the Sansthan encourages the candidates to become self-reliant and enables them to take up self or wage-based employment.

**Achievements:**The institution has earned a good name as one of the best in the Country in providing skill-based training. To justify this, the Sansthan has scored the highest marks in the third-party evaluation conducted by the external research institute (G.B. Pant Social Science Institute), commissioned by the Government of India. For its noteworthy contribution in the field of vocational training, the Govt. of India conferred the prestigious NLM-UNESCO award to the institute.

### **JSS Krishi Vignana Kendra (Agricultural Sciences Centre)**

JSS Krishi Vignana Kendra (Agricultural Sciences Centre) was established in the year 1994 at Suttur. The Centre is sanctioned by the Indian Council for Agricultural Research (ICAR), Government of India. It engages in the transfer of the technical know-how to the farmers, enabling them to adopt modern agronomic policies. Sri Math has given 52 acres of its land, which is being utilized for conducting demonstrations for cultivating crops like paddy, sugarcane, mulberry, etc., by adopting the latest farming practices. Apart from this, experts visit the fields of trained farmers and give them further guidance and ensure that the farmers practice modern agricultural methods to increase crop output. Training programmes on farming practices and methods are being conducted for farmers, women, and youth periodically. They are prompted to adopt modern methods of agriculture to reap better benefits from farming. In a year about 2229 farmers have been trained under various programmes.

## JSS Hiriya Mane - JSS Senior Citizens' Homes

Owing to the declining values of intra-family relations and the societal values in general, many elderly persons who are in the evening of their lives have to undergo physical and mental stress. Those who once lived a joyful, and healthy life in a family are now devoid of affection and care. It was necessary to provide a roof on their head to help them gain mental poise and peace and lead a peaceful, anxiety-free, dignified life.. There are two free units of senior citizens' homes in Mysuru and the inmates are provided with free lodging, boarding, and medical care. Physically fit inmates are trained in the manufacturing of chalk piece, garlands using silk cocoons, etc., to keep them engaged. Every day, in the morning and the evening, the inmates perform mass prayers. They also spend time in the well-equipped library, reading newspapers, magazines, and books peacefully. On the occasions of national and religious festivals' days, feasts are arranged, and games are organized to entertain them and also, prizes are awarded. The home is taken care of by a Manager and seven supporting staff.



**JSS Old Age Home, Suttur**

For senior citizens seeking to spend their twilight years in a peaceful and comfortable place, JSS Hiriya Mane is the place to be. There are two senior citizens' homes built in the tranquil surroundings of Suttur Srikshetra, out of which one is a free home. The free home can accommodate fifty people. Here, all the services are available free of cost. In addition to this, another Old Age Home, available on a paid basis which can house about ten inmates is also run. The home is equipped with all modern amenities. About five personnel maintain the home, which also includes a manager.

A 8 days training program for Ethiopian FDA officials was organized under JSSAHER ,Mysuru Department of Pharmaceutical Biotechnology Trained two of the EFDA officials (Miss Tiringo Mengaw and Mrs Beletu Abate ) under medical microbiology . The JSSAHER officials welcomed the EFDA officials in Indian tradition latter they were deputed to the respective departments for the training.

The 7 days training program for the Ethiopian FDA officials was hosted by JSS AHER, Mysuru at JSS College of Pharmacy, Ooty from 19 – 25 January 2023. About 9 delegates working in the various disciplines of Ethiopian FDA including QC chemist for Pharmaceuticals & Food, Regulatory auditors, Food inspectors and microbiologists participated in the training program.

Department of Biotechnology, Mr. Betizaz Damew Belete was provided seven days training Advanced Medicine Microbiology Techniques for Bacterial Endotoxin, Microbial Limit & Sterility Testing.Training sessions on bacterial endotoxin tests, antimicrobial assays, growth promotion tests, preservative efficacy tests, and clean room design were provided for EFDA officials.

Twelve officials from Ethiopian Food and Drug Administration (EFDA) underwent 8 days training program in the areas of Analytical Instrumentation, Medicine Microbiology and Audit Inspection from 28th June to 05th July 2022. The 8 days training program for the Ethiopian FDA officials was hosted by JSS AHER, Mysuru at JSS College of Pharmacy, Ooty. The delegates working at the various disciplines in Ethiopian FDA for Pharmaceuticals & Food, Regulatory auditors, Food inspectors and microbiologists were trained in the various fields of Advanced analytical techniques–LC-MS/MS, GC-MS/MS, HPTLC, Advanced Medicine Microbiology Techniques for Bacterial Endotoxin, Microbial Limit & Sterility Testing, and Advanced audit Inspection Techniques. This is a first of its kind initiative by a higher education institute in India to support the regulatory systems in Pharma internationally. Ethiopian FDA officials expressed their great satisfaction with the training provided by the trainers and appreciated the hospitality extended and the efforts put forth the trainers to teach them at JSS College of Pharmacy, Ooty.09 officials from Ethiopian Food and Drug Administration (EFDA) underwent 7 days training program in the areas of Analytical Instrumentation, Medicine Microbiology and Regulatory Audits & Inspection from 18th to 25th January 2023. This is a first of its kind initiative by a higher education institute in India to support the regulatory systems in Pharma Inspection giving a new dimension to internationalization and globalization efforts at JSS AHER, Mysuru by sharing of knowledge and expertise in the domain of regulatory affairs.

### **8).Current Good Manufacturing Practices (cGMP) Online workshop for Pharmaceutical Units in Active Pharmaceutical Ingredients (API) and Formulations for Access to Quality-Assured Medical Products**

WHO had undertaken a joint SEARO-WHO India Survey on Pharmaceutical Units in India, with an inter-ministerial effort of Govt of India. It led to several key recommendations for several ministries in India for pharmaceutical units engaged in manufacturing APIs, formulations, and medical devices to promote access to medical products for meeting national and global health needs. Strengthening current GMP with the support of WHO among pharmaceutical manufacturers was one major recommendations of the Survey. The Good Manufacturing Practices (cGMP) Online Workshop is conceptualized, to take the recommendations forward and also to address COVID-19 challenges. The Workshop is being organized and implemented by all three levels of WHO (Country Office, Regional Office, HQ) in collaboration with JSS Academy of Higher Education & Research (JSS AHER), Mysuru, Indian Pharmaceutical Alliance (IPA) with Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India.

- Training and facility / systems upgradation of manufacturers of medicines (formulations and APIs)/ biologicals / medical devices to cGMP.
- Pharmaceutical units have improved knowledge to meet WHO Prequalification requirements and other world class quality standards beginning with a pilot phase in India and later rolled out to other SEARN member states.
- Building capacity and upgradation of Quality Culture and Quality management in medical products including medicines, vaccines, antisera and medical devices manufacturing facilities.
- Understanding GMP in terms of risk-based and quality system-based approach, principles behind key aspects of cGMP including utilities, water systems, HVAC, process validation, cleaning validation among others for non-sterile and sterile products.
- Promote availability, affordability and access to quality-assured medicines and medical products.
- Understanding of the use of Artificial Intelligence in Drug Design and Development and Clinical Trial Data Analytics.

### **9.)Mentorship Program for Industries engaged in manufacture of active pharmaceutical ingredients (API), pharmaceutical formulations and medical devices for capacity building towards WHO pre-qualification and promote availability and access to quality medicines for meeting national and global needs**

To support the Indian Pharma and medical devices SME manufacturing units, A first of its kind, Series of six Virtual Workshops (03 for APIs, 02 for Formulation and 01 for IVDs- Medical Devices manufacturing units) on Good Manufacturing Practices (cGMP) was organized and implemented by



all three levels of WHO (Country Office, Regional Office, Head Quarters) in collaboration with JSS Academy of Higher Education & Research (JSS AHER), Mysuru, Indian Pharmaceutical Alliance (IPA) and with Indian Ministry of Health and partners - USAID funded programs, MTaPS and PQM+. Based on the feedback, the mentorship program to encourage participation of manufacturing units for Prequalification to ensure availability of products that are of quality, safety and efficacy, in order to optimize use of health resources and improved health outcomes is proposed.
