Introduction

Sustainable Development Goal 10 aims at reducing inequality within and among countries. This SDG calls for reducing inequalities in income as well as those based on age, sex, disability, race, ethnicity, origin, religion or economic or other status within a country. The goal also addresses inequalities among countries, including those related to representation, migration and development assistance.

The Goal has ten targets to be achieved by 2030. The first seven targets are outcome targets: Reduce <u>income inequalities</u>; promote universal social, economic and political inclusion; ensure <u>equal opportunities</u> and end <u>discrimination</u>; adopt fiscal and social policies that promotes equality; improved regulation of global <u>financial markets</u> and institutions; enhanced representation for <u>developing countries</u> in <u>financial institutions</u>; responsible and wellmanaged migration policies. The other three targets are means of implementation targets. Special and differential treatment for developing countries; encourage <u>development</u> <u>assistance</u> and investment in <u>least developed countries</u>; reduce transaction costs for migrant <u>remittances</u>.




JSS Academy of Higher Education & Research is a renowned Institute for its educational and employment policies and has certainly earned its name for the level of transparency it maintains in all its deeds.

On 2nd August small video demonstration programme was conducted in UHC OPD for ANC & PNC women on breast feeding techniques and hygiene. UHC Medical officer Dr.Krishnaveni Y.S. and OBG post graduate Dr.Devika spoke on methods of breast feeding, exclusive breast feeding and discussed on problems faced by mothers in bf. Participants clarified about their doubts on myths and beliefs about breast feeding.Similar programmes were also conducted in RMC F block on 3rd august where PNC women were shown videos on proper breast feeding techniques and were educated about EBF. And in programme conducted in medar block Anganwadi no 70, 9 women participated where nursing students showed pictures of bf techniques and methods.
