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
INTRODUCTION


Climate Change: A Looming Global Crisis

Climate change refers to the long-term alteration of Earth's climate patterns due to human activities and natural processes. It is one of the most pressing challenges facing humanity and the planet. The primary driver of climate change in recent times is the increased concentration of greenhouse gases (GHGs) in the atmosphere, primarily carbon dioxide (CO2), methane (CH4), and nitrous oxide (N2O). These gases trap heat from the sun, causing the Earth's temperature to rise, leading to a cascade of far-reaching environmental and societal impacts.


As global temperatures climb, widespread shifts in weather systems occur, making events like droughts, hurricanes, and floods more intense and unpredictable. Extreme weather events that may have hit just once in our grandparents' lifetimes are becoming more common in ours. However, not every place will experience the same effects: Climate change may cause severe drought in one region while making floods more likely in another.

The Goal is aimed at integrating climate change measures, disaster risk measures and sustainable natural resource management into national development strategies. Efforts at the national level for adopting green technologies, promoting the use of clean and modern source of energy, advocating for behavioural change for sustainable use of resources, must be complemented by international cooperation on climate change since the causes and effects of climate change transcend national boundaries.

SAPLING PLANTS AND ITS ADOPTION

JSS AHER had taken an initiative for planting saplings and adoption of 107 plants across JSS AHER campuses in commemoration of Celebration of 107th Jayanthi Mahotsav of His Holiness Jagadguru Dr. Sri Shivaratri Rajendra Mahaswamiji on 07.09.2022 the founder father of JSS Mahavidyapeetha – a parent organisation of JSSAHER. Dr. B Manjunatha, Registrar, JSS AHER welcomed the gathering. Dr. C G Betsurmath, Executive Secretary Presided and Dr. B Suresh, Pro-Chancellor, JSS AHER & Dr. Surinder Singh, Vice Chancellor, JSS AHER were the Guests of Honor. Dr. C Naganna, the Chief Guest inaugurated the programme by watering the plant and the same has been planted in the JSS AHER Campus. In this connection volunteers were welcomed to plant saplings and adopt them for a period of three years. Volunteers registered through online form in the JSSAHER Website: www.jssuni.edu.in and planted the 107 saplings of 15 varieties across its campuses. Dr. C Naganna summarized the life of His Holiness Jagadguru Dr. Sri Shivarathri Rajendra Mahaswamiji with real life examples. He mentioned that His Holiness Mahaswamiji served society for wellbeing of the humanity selflessly. 5 distinguished alumni of JSS Medical College, JSS Dental College & Hospital and JSS College of Pharmacy of JSS AHER who have extended their dedicated and exemplary services to the society were felicitated in the programme.







VERMICOMPOSTING

Vermicomposting is a simple biotechnological process of composting, in which certain species of earthworms are used to enhance the process of waste conversion and produce a better end product. A team started the project Vermicomposting in JSS AHER campus. The prior knowledge and the assistance for the vermicomposting were received by the direction of scientists from the ICAR JSS KVK, Mysore.

Good quality compost production in ambient temperature can be accomplished in shorter time by the process of vermicomposting that involves use of proper species of earthworms. The native cellulase activity of earthworms and microorganisms in earthworm gut promote faster decomposition of ingested organic material. The combined effect of enzymatic activity and grinding of organic materials to fineness by earthworms produces the vermicomposting and this is not observed in compost pits without earthworm.









RAINWATER HARVESTING

Rainwater harvesting collection tank of 30,000 Litres storage capacity. 10 no.s of Groundwater & bore well recharge pits and infiltration tank of about 15,000 Litres capacity. STP of 25 KLD capacity by using SWR technology has been installed for treating sewage & kitchen wastewater of PG Guest Hostel & the treated water is used for the gardening area developed surrounding the building. One tank of 10,000 litres capacity is made for reuse of RO rejected water for gardening Purposes Water sprinklers are in place.



WASTE MANAGEMENT

I. Biomedical waste management

Biomedical waste management in the JSS hospital, Medical College, and allied health centres follow the Biomedical Waste Management Rules 2016. Generated Biomedical waste in health centres follows the following step before it is treated.

II. General waste

- Segregation and collection of dry and wet garbage are in practice.
- Color-coded dustbins are provided across the campus
- Waste collection by municipal lorries regularly from all the sites.
- Swachh Sarvekshan posters are put up in various places in the hospital, medical college, and hostel premises.

OXYGEN PLANT

With the Divine presence of His Holiness Swamiji, Sri. Basavaraj S Bommai, Hon'ble Chief Minister, Govt. of Karnataka inaugurated Oxygen Plant on 26.12.2021 at 4.30 p.m. at JSS Hospital, Mysuru. Dr. K Sudhakar - Hon'ble Minister for Health & Family Welfare and Medical Education and other dignitaries were present in the inauguration program.

In view of creating a greater number of oxygen beds due to the high demand, the management has decided to increase LMO tank capacity, accordingly we have installed additional 13KL capacity of LMO plant along with the existing 13KL capacity tank at our hospital on 29-11-2021.

We had successfully treated 5000 COVID patients at our hospital with 205 oxygen lines during first wave of COVID-19 pandemic. During 2nd wave nearly 2000 COVID patients from Mysore and surrounding regions have been treated by extending another 150 oxygen beds.

The subject has core concepts and methods from ecological and physical sciences and their application in environmental problem solving and makes them understand the transnational character of environmental problems and ways of addressing them, including interactions across local to global scales. The outcome which was intended to be achieved was to reflect critically about their roles and identities as citizens, consumers and environmental actors in a complex, interconnected world and also deepen the understanding the utility of environmental source.

Complementing the academic curriculum, the department also encourages to take part in various community activities contributing towards the goal 'Climate Action'. The below information gives clear insights into the department initiatives leading to create green environment.

School cleaning and sapling plantation

Environment Day Celebrations


World Environment Day was celebrated on June 5th, 2023, with full enthusiasm and drive to the conservation of Nature Jointly by the Department of Health System Management Studie NSS Unit of the Department of Health System Management Studies and Nutrition and Diete CP Madhu Medical Superintendent of JSS Hospital was the Chief Guest. Guests of Honour w TS Harsha Assistant Professor, KSOU, Dr. HK Mamatha, Dean and Coordinator, Department of Health System Management Studies, and Dr. Vanitha Reddy, Coordinator of Nutrition and D were present.

A short Movie on Solutions to Plastic was projected on the occasion by students of the department.

Programmes and activities organized aligning to this goal



Schematic representation of development of solar driven transfer of atmospheric nitrogen to ammonia.

The development of solar-driven transfer of atmospheric nitrogen into ammonia is one of the green and sustainable strategies in industrial ammonia production. Nickel-titanium-layered double hydroxide (NiTi-LDH) was synthesized using the soft-chemical process for atmospheric nitrogen fixation application under photocatalysis in an aqueous system. NiTi-LDH was investigated using advanced characterization techniques and confirmed the potential oxygen vacancies and/or surface defects owing to better photocatalytic activity under the solar spectrum. It also exhibited a bandgap of 2.8 eV that revealed its promising visible-light catalytic activities. A maximum of 33.52μ mol L-1 aqueous NH3 was obtained by continuous nitrogen (99.9% purity) supply into the photoreactor under an LED light source. Atmospheric nitrogen supply (\approx 78%) yielded 14.67 μ mol L-1 aqueous NH3 within 60 min but gradually reduced to 3.6 μ mol L-1 at 330 min. interestingly, in weak acidic pH, 20.90 μ mol L-1 NH3 was produced compared to 11.51 μ mol L-1 NH3 in basic pH. The application of NiTi-LDH for visible-light harvesting capability and photoreduction of atmospheric N2 into NH3 thereby opens a new horizon of eco-friendly NH3 production using natural sunlight as alternative driving energy.

International Workshop on "Combating Plastic Pollution in Terrestrial Environment" was held on 14th March 2023, organized by the JSS Academy of Higher Education & Research (JSSAHER), Mysuru, in association with Centre for Science and Technology of the Non-Aligned and other developing countries (NAM S&T Centre) New Delhi, India, and Scientific Committee on Problems of the Environment (SCOPE), Amstelveen the Netherlands.

Dr. B Manjunatha, Registrar, JSS AHER delivered the welcome speech. Dr. Amitava Bandopadhyay, Director General, NAM S&T Centre, New Delhi presented the welcome remarks and emphasized the impact of plastic pollution. Especially plastic-based greenhouses. Dr. Shanth A. Thimmaiah Chairman, Karnataka, State Pollution Control Board, Govt. of Karnataka, Chief Guest of the program, addressed the importance of combating plastic pollution and its effects on the modern environment.

Dr. C G Betsurmath, Executive Secretary, JSS Mahavidyapeetha, Mysuru, delivered the presidential address and reiterated the importance of organizing such a platform on plastic pollution in the terrestrial environment. He also recollected about Mysore which was India's cleanest city once, and the efforts of the team were appreciated to achieve and expressed his desire to maintain and achieve the same in the future too.

Dr. Jon Samseth, President, of SCOPE, Netherlands was addressed shared about latest technologies adopted for separating, sorting, and processing waste plastics and the challenges of plastics recovery. Dr. Surinder Singh, Vice Chancellor, JSS AHER, India in his opening remarks assured about JSS AHER a plastic-free zone to facilitate a free green plastic environment.

Dr. B. Suresh, Pro-Chancellor, JSS AHER, Mysuru India delivered the inaugural address and shared his thoughts on Plastic production and profitability on its production and societal comfort however, the focus on its re usability needs more concern and overcoming plastic pollution. Dr. Vishal Kumar Gupta, Dean (Academics) JSS AHER in his introductory speech, highlighted about the relevance of the workshop on the plastic pollution and management in the environment. Dr. Suriyanarayanan. S (SCOPE, INDIA) proposed a vote of thanks.

More than 150 participants, including research scholars, students, faculty members, and industry experts from different countries participated in this workshop. 50 poster presentations and 28 oral presentations are presented, and 6 eminent experts shared their knowledge and research findings on the usage of plastics its refuse, reuse, and recycling aspects, and its management in the terrestrial environment.




Solar panel @ JSS College of Pharmacy, Mysuru

Green Campus Policy and its initiatives

The college campus boasts a lush green environment, with seasonal trees and regular garden maintenance to ensure its cleanliness. To promote environmental resilience, we have introduced

car and scooter pooling for staff and students living in the same area. Additionally, we plan to encourage cycling within the campus and implement a monthly 'No Vehicle Day.' Some students have already embraced this idea and started commuting to college on bicycles.

In the short term, we aim to establish organic farming to meet the demand for vegetables and fruits, and we are in the process of finalizing the land for this purpose. Moreover, the college features an herbal garden displaying various medicinal plants, providing fresh air and relief from ailments. To uphold cleanliness standards, we are considering outsourcing the housekeeping facilities on the campus. Furthermore, we are committed to tree planting initiatives both within the college and in adopted tribal villages to maintain an eco-friendly and green environment.

Environmental education measures

The campaign aims to eliminate open defecation, build and maintain toilets, and improve waste management systems.

Swachh Bharat Abhiyan encourages community participation, urging citizens to take responsibility for their surroundings. The initiative has made significant progress in raising awareness about cleanliness and bringing about positive changes in sanitation across the country.

As a part of environment conservation initiatives and under the banner of Swacch Bharath Abhiyan, the College conducts campaigns on climate change risks, impacts, mitigation, adaptation, impact reduction to the local residents and adopted villages. This is performed with the assistance of National Social Service Scheme of the college.





Disaster Early Warning and Monitoring System- Landslides





The collaboration between Vellore Institute of Technology (VIT) and the Department of Science and Technology in JSS College of Pharmacy, Ooty, aims to establish a comprehensive forewarning system for landslides in the Nilgiris region. The primary focus is on deploying Tensiometer, an essential geotechnical instrument, to monitor soil moisture and provide crucial data for landslide prediction and early detection.

The Nilgiris region, known for its hilly terrain and frequent heavy rainfall, is prone to landslides, causing significant damage to property and posing risks to human lives. To address this issue, the project seeks to develop a proactive approach to anticipate landslides before they occur. This requires a reliable and accurate system to monitor soil moisture levels, a critical factor influencing landslide occurrences.

Tensiometer are specialized devices that measure soil moisture tension, which is the force that retains water in the soil against the pull of gravity. By placing Tensiometer at strategic locations within the landslide-prone areas of Nilgiris, researchers can continuously assess soil moisture conditions. This data, combined with weather forecasts and other environmental parameters, will enable the development of predictive models and algorithms to anticipate potential landslide events.

The collaboration brings together experts in geotechnical engineering, environmental sciences, and data analytics, creating a multidisciplinary approach to address the landslide challenges in the region. The project's goal is to provide local authorities and communities with timely and accurate forewarnings, allowing them to take proactive measures to mitigate the impact of landslides and enhance overall disaster preparedness.

Through the successful implementation of the Tensiometer-based forewarning system, the project aims to establish a template for similar initiatives in other landslide-prone regions. By leveraging technological advancements and academic expertise, this collaboration can contribute significantly to safeguarding lives and properties in the Nilgiris and potentially make a positive impact on landslide management practices globally.


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were actively participated. The Volunteers and delegates won few prizes during the event. Over all the
