

## **LIBRARY & INFORMATION CENTRE:**

The College has an exclusive library with 48201 collections covering all the branches of Medical Science like Anatomy, Physiology, Biochemistry, and Pathology. Microbiology Genetics, Pharmacology, Forensic Medicine, Community Medicine, ENT, Ophthalmology Medicine, Surgery, OBG, Orthopedics, Pediatrics, Dermatology. Radiology. Anesthesia Psychiatry, Clinical Psychology, Transfusion Medicine, Geriatric, Hospital Administration Medical education unit, Occupational therapy, Cardiology, Neurology, Nephrology, Urology Respiratory Medicine, Neurosurgery, Gastroenterology, and general books. The library resources include a good collection of prescribed reference books, textbooks, recommended books, reference works like encyclopedias dictionaries, handbooks, directories, date books journal back volumes, WHO-technical reports, project reports, etc. The library subscribes to 252 National and International journals and has a fairly good collection of back volumes for reference, research works, project reports, and dissertations.

The library, one of the very important organ of the educational system, is the center of all activities on the campus. Situated in an easily accessible place, it covers **3205 sq mts. With 650 seating capacity, and occupies seven sections namely the Reference, Circulation, Journal, Book bank, Newspaper, Office/technical section, and Digital section.**

JSS Hospital library is an extension of the central/main library, which was established for ready/immediate reference for the benefit of the faculty and students of clinical departments.

In addition to the information needs of the students, the library also has a separate book bank for socially and economically weaker students and can avail this facility.

The members will also be permitted to access the other information centers on request through the inter library scheme.

The library provides access to Clinical Key Online Full-text Online Database i.e., 1150+full textbooks, 650+ full-text Journals, 2800 pharmacology monographs, 15000 patient education handouts, and 2000+practice guidelines,13,000 medical and surgical videos, MEDLINE indexed Abstract, Millions of Images, etc. Scopus-Citation and Abstract Database, and Knowledge Genine- Abstract Database to 3600+e-journals, electronic corporate databases, newspapers, etc., and the library utilizes IT extensively to ensure the remote access of available resources. The library provides free Wi-Fi internet browsing facilities for the benefit of the students and staff members and is interconnected with the other leading libraries/centers.

“Koha”, the library management software is a fully featured, scalable library management system, and provides online access to catalogue, databases, and journal information. The library has an open access system & remote access to OPAC. The Smart Campus package has been successfully implemented for the circulation activities, by using the barcode system. All the books in the library are bar-coded.

The library books are classified using Dewey Decimal Classification system. The library is completely automated with barcodes for computerized circulation and OPAC through intranet and internet.

An exclusive Digital Library and a CD-ROM information center is also maintained for the benefit of the students. The library also maintains a good collection of CDs on different subjects.

Visitors, alumni as well as outsiders, can also make use of the library through identification and payment of some fees.

### Report on the Library workshop conducted at Ooty

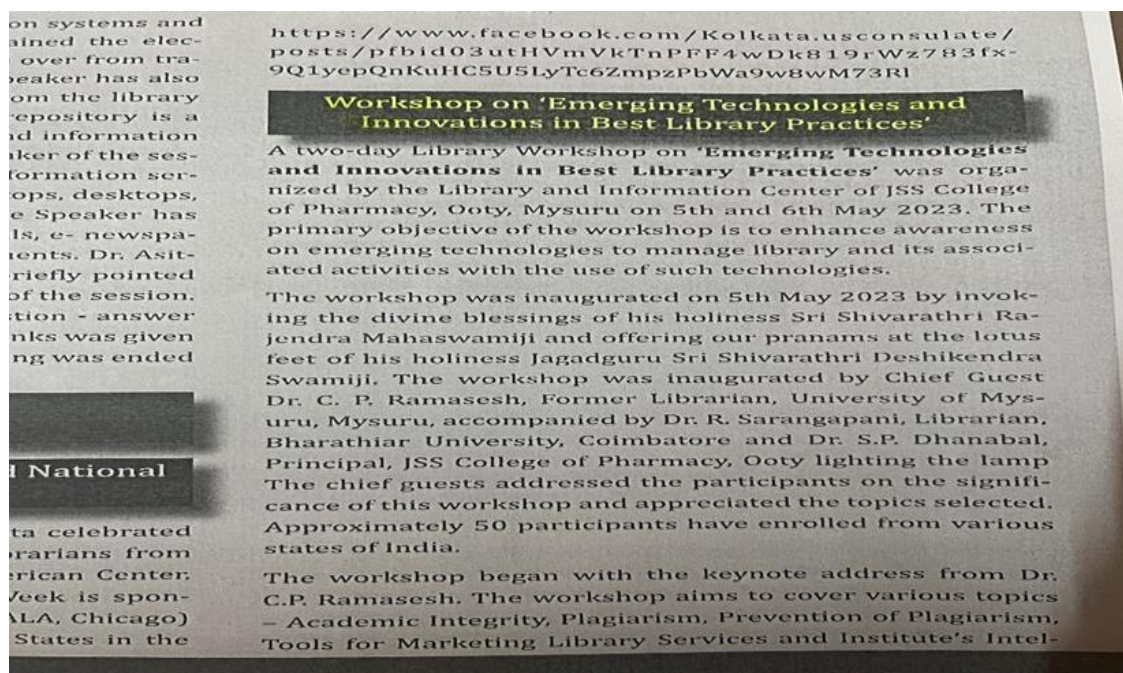

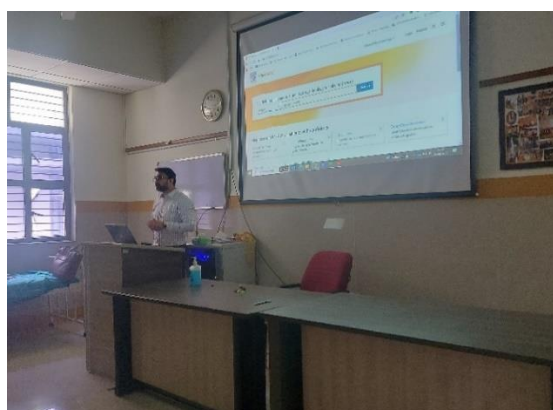

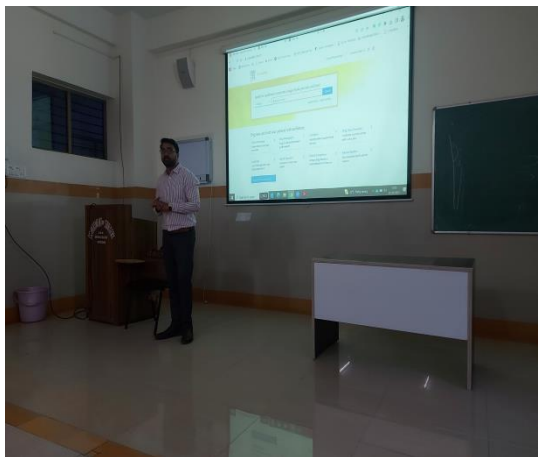
The response from the participants was very appreciative and am confident such awareness training will encourage the users to utilize ClinicalKey more efficiently and improve usage.

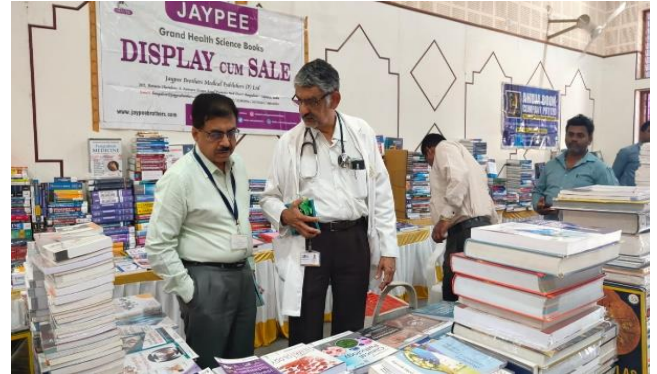




## Book Exhibition to commemorate National Librarians' Day

**Introduction:**

In our ongoing efforts to bridge the gaps between the library resources and its users, the Library and Information Center of all the constituent colleges of JSS AHER organized a 2-Day Training Program on the 'Effective Utilization of subscribed E-Resources' on 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> February 2024 for faculty, Ph.D. students, and PG students.

**Objective:**

The primary objective of the program was to create awareness amongst the faculty and students on the subscribed e-resources (such as Access Pharmacy, Medicine, Surgery collection, BMJ, the EBSCO Pharmacy collection, and SCOPUS & Clinical Key) to enhance subject knowledge within their respective areas and provide all the needed guidance, including the access.

**Day 1 (1<sup>st</sup> February 2024)**

**Session 1: "Demo on Access Pharmacy, Medicine, Surgery collection"**

- Resource Person: Mr. G V Kishore, Account Manager, South & East, McGraw Hill, Access Pharmacy.
- Mr. G V Kishore initiated the first session with a talk on "Demo on Access Pharmacy, Medicine, Surgery collection" He provided insights on accessing, and elaborated on e-journals and e-books.

**Session 1: Demo on EBSCO Pharmacy Collection**

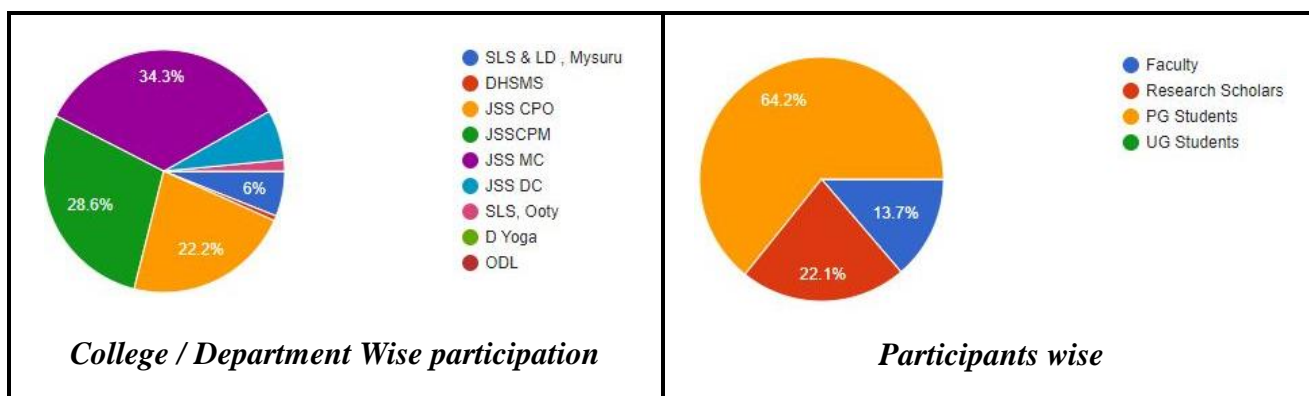
- Resource Person: Mr. Divakar. Marketing Manager, EBSCO
