

His Holiness Jagadguru Dr. Sri Sri Shivarathri Rajendra Mahaswamiji, the 23rd Pontiff of Jagadguru Sri Veerasimhasana Mahasamsthana Math, popularly known as Sri Suttur Math, inherited the legacy of the 10 century old Srimath at an early age. He was born on 29-8-1916 and ascended the peetha on 28-2-1928 when he was hardly twelve. He shared the responsibilities with his senior, Jagadguru pattada Shivarathri Mahaswamigalu. He shouldered the responsibilities of the Srimath for more than half a century, taking each step towards service of humanity on every possible way.

Besides being the patron of arts, literature and music, he was a scholar in kannada and Sanskrit. He sacrificed his educational career to provide succor to the helpless poor. The Burning desire to assuage the educational needs of lakhs of rural children, he started the first free Hostel at Mysore in 1941. Thus began his journey of socio-economic transformation of the region with the establishment of Schools, Colleges and Sanskrit Pathashalas in and around Mysore. A single-minded dedication, aimed at the welfare of all, goaded him to tread the path of sacrifice. The Incredible divine grace coupled with intense and sustained focus resulted in materialization of his great dreams of establishing free schools and hostels, professional colleges, centers of art, music and literature etc. Jagadguru Dr. Sri Shivarathri Rajendra Mahaswamiji had a strong vision of starting educational institutions in rural areas considering the hardship of students coming to cities seeking education. In order to make this possible, he started the Jagadguru Sri Shivarathreeswara Mahavidyapeetha in 1954. Under the untiring efforts of Jagadguru Dr. Sri Shivarathri Rajendra Mahaswamiji, the Vidyapeetha has witnessed enormous growth in the field of education. Thousands of children, men and women found solace under his boundless compassion.

An election is a way for people to choose their candidate or express their preferences in a representative democracy or other form of government. To support and sensitise students on this issue, the NSS unit at JSS Medical College, Mysuru, organised a voting awareness programme for the students of JSS Medical College. The programme was conducted on 24th April 2024, between 10:30 AM and 11:20 AM, in Gallery 6, third floor, JSS Medical College, Mysuru. We have invited two resource persons, Ms Amoolya Prasad and Ms Anagha K. Landsteiner was awarded the Nobel Prize for his discovery of the ABO blood group system. The theme for World Blood Donor Day 2024 is **“Give blood and keep the world-beating”**. The theme highlights the value of blood donors and their roles in promoting health and saving lives.

In this regard, a series of awareness activities are scheduled. The drawing competition was organized by the NSS unit, JSS Medical College, and JSS AHER on **“WORLD BLOOD DONOR DAY”-2024**. This competition was organised to raise awareness about the importance of donating blood for a noble cause and to encourage participation from students of the medical, dental, and public health schools, as well as allied health sciences, and other constituent colleges of JSS AHER. Approximately 20 students participated in the event, held on June 1, 2024, from 10 am to 12 pm, in the Shree Rajendra Auditorium, second floor, JSS Medical College. We had invited our judges, Dr Vijaya Vageesh, Associate Professor, Department of Physiology, JSS MC & Dr Siddesha, Assistant Professor, Department of Biochemistry, JSS FLS. All participants received participation certificates from our judges.

The first Prize was bagged by Ms Riyah, JSS Dental College, the second prize by Ms Anvitha Bhat, JSS Medical College, and the third prize by Ms Anju, JSS Medical College.

The event not only served as a platform for showcasing talent but also highlighted the college's commitment to making a positive impact on society.

3. BLOOD DONATION CAMP:2024

In the honor of the 20th Anniversary of Blood Donation Day, National Services Scheme, in association with the first ever JSS Red Cross Club conducted a blood donation camp that took place on 8th of June 2024, in the JSS Pharmacy College Auditorium. The event was made possible by the Blood Bank of JSS Hospital, Mysuru.

The event was inaugurated with a lamp lighting ceremony presided by the Principal of College of Pharmacy: Dr. Pramod T M Kumar, Principal of JSS Medical College: Dr. Basavana Gowdappa H., Administrative Officer of JSSMC:

Mr. Satish Chandra S R, Dr. Pallavi P: Blood Bank Coordinator from JSSH, and Dr. Archana M from the Dept of Pathology, Dr. U R Rakshith (JSSPCM) and Dr. M V Ravishankar (JSSMC) as NSS Program Officers and Dr. Mythily M R from Dept of Community Medicine, also the nodal officer and faculty coordinator for JSS Red Cross Club.



The event started at 10 am with Dr. Archana M taking the blood donor's pledge along with the donors present. The donors went on for proper screening, first by signing the pledge for voluntary donation, then subsequent screening. Proper food intake before donation, weight, blood pressure, Hb level and if any other criteria for blood donation, everything was considered. Proper screening for donors was done.

Over 40 donors showed up, but due to a strict screening session, only 23 donors could donate. Amongst the donors, we had blood groups such as B negative as well. After the donation, the donors were made to rest well on separate beds for at least 10 minutes and were provided with fruits and juices.

Apart from the donors, almost 10 volunteers were present at the venue to help run everything smoothly, both from NSS and JSS Red Cross Club. The enthusiasm of the donors and those who came willingly to donate, was commendable. The event successfully ended at 1:30 pm.

This event was only made possible by the combined efforts of JSS Medical College and JSS College of Pharmacy together, with the help of Blood Bank from JSS Hospital, Mysuru. It was a very successful event.

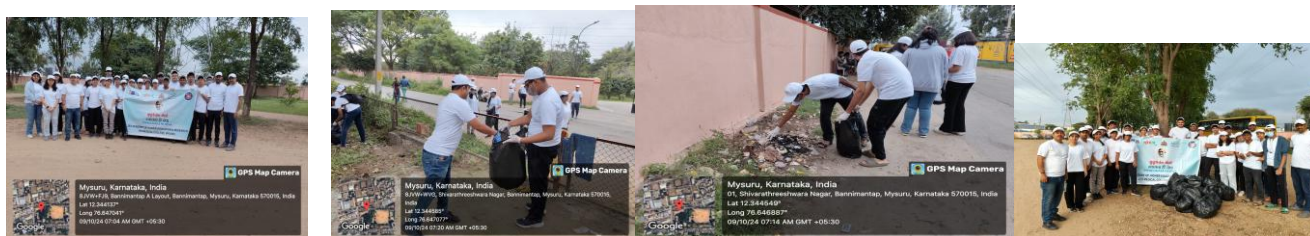
9. Swachh Bharath Cleanliness drive

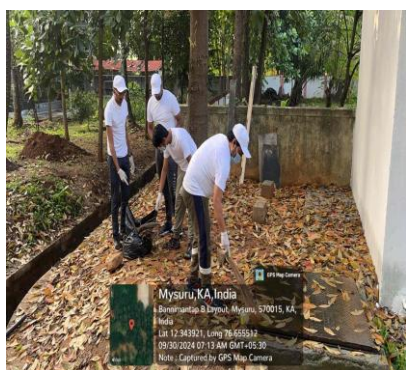

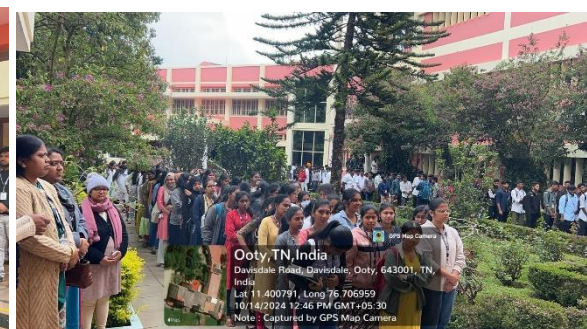
03.10.2024 Celebration of SWEEP (Systematic voters education and electrol participation)

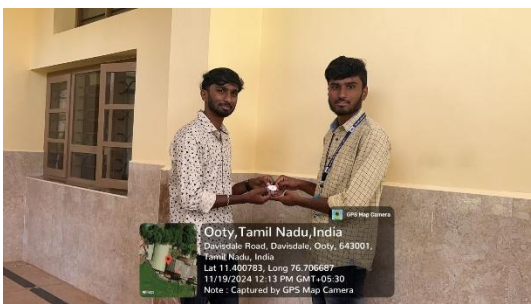
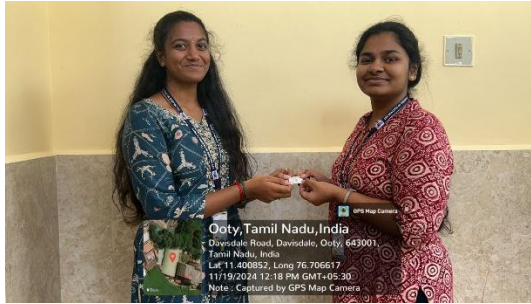
07.11.2024 – Blood Donation Camp

02.03.2025 Health Awareness Walkathon Rally on “World Obesity Day” Walk For Life

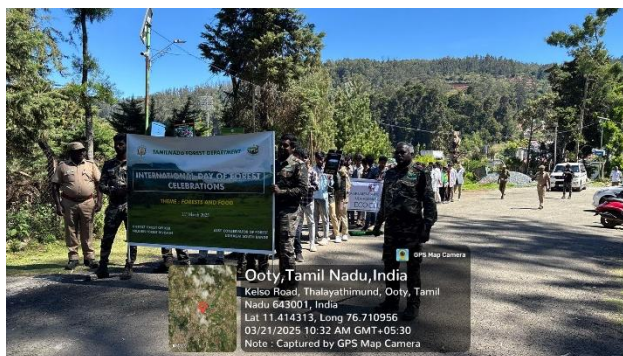

21.03.2025 – Awareness rally and Tree Plantation on “International Day of Forest” Celebration.

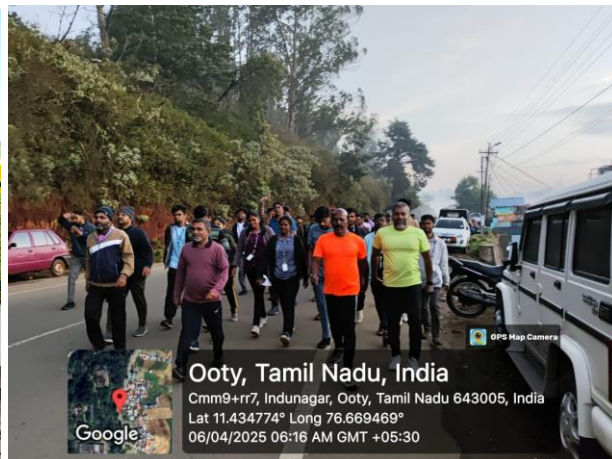

Maulana Azad Model Schools in Mysuru, Karnataka, are English medium schools which are run by the Minority Welfare Department. These institutions are established to provide education for children from minority groups. The schools provide education from grade 6 to 10.

These schools are in Rajendra Nagar, Lashkar Mohalla, and Bharatnagar in Mysuru. Volunteers served in the school located in Rajendra nagar, next to Minority welfare department. Admission to these schools can be obtained by submitting the application forms given in the MWD and in respective schools.

The school volunteers went, had 100 to 150 students studying there. There are seven teachers who teach Kannada, Hindi, English, social, science and mathematics subjects who are headed by the headmaster Ms.



Anusuya K. There are 5 classrooms for grade 6 to 10, with the facility of washroom for girls and boys. The mid-day meal is also given to the students and faculty.

7. About the faculty

At this school, Ms Anusuya works as the principal, she provides leadership and guidance to establish a well-structured academic environment. This school has a team of six dedicated teachers. These teachers handle different subjects for the students from sixth to tenth grade. The subjects taught by the teachers include Hindi, English, Kannada, Science, Mathematics, and Social Studies. Here the teachers adopt a student-centric approach, tailoring the teaching methods to match the learning pace of all the students. The teachers deliver the lessons in a clear and engaging manner, ensuring that students fully grasp key concepts. To ensure the learning process of the students, the teachers track their academic progress through class tests after the completion of the chapters. These assessments help the teacher to identify the areas where the students may require some additional support, allowing the teachers to provide valuable feedback and necessary corrections. Through this structured and supportive approach, the school aims to promote a strong foundation for knowledge and educational skill among students.



Experience

Geetha TJ, NSS volunteer from SLS, JSS AHER taught English for students of class 10th and took classes on daily basis for 20 days which were at 1 or 2 periods in a day.

In class 10, there were 32 students, who were good in reading but average in vocabulary and English, they were a bit disturbing, however she gained control in future days. Later they became friendly and obeying. She taught them 3 lessons and 2 poems, conducted unit tests after completion of each chapter. She also conducted FA test at the last. The students had gradually started giving interest in the subject after conducting various activities like learning new word every day, learning the meanings of words present in textbook and explaining them in their own words other than byhearting, this ensured that they understood the concept rather than mugging up. She also asked concept-based questions in everyday class to ensure that they are understanding what she was teaching and all doubts were cleared and feedback was taken to make sure if they wanted any change in teaching style. During the last days the students had bonded very well and also asked if she could join them in their school trip which was to Madakeri but due to time constraints it was not possible.

Akshatha Ram Kumar, was assigned to teach mathematics for class 6 which had an approximate of 36 students. While some students were slightly mischievous, the overall experience was enjoyable and enriching. To ensure good engagement she begin with interactive sessions which incorporate small games to get to know the students and to build a bond with them. At the beginning, she did try to understand their prior learning. After assessing their knowledge she focused on strengthening their basics before introducing them to the chapters: Decimals, Data Handling, and Algebra. She begin from the basic level questions to the advanced level which would in total help them to prepare for the exams. After every unit she administered them through class tests to evaluate their understanding. Based on these results She also identified the areas required for the improvement and simplified the concept to enhance their



understanding. Despite the initial challenges the overall teaching experience became more seamless and it was truly rewarding to guide and support the students in that learning journey.



Navya P, taught science to 7th and 8th standard students, with around 40 students in each class. Volunteering at the school and teaching science to the students was a valuable experience. She covered topics like reproduction in plants and sound, using plenty of examples to make the lessons more relatable. Whenever possible, she demonstrated simple experiments, which helped keep the students engaged. They were curious and eager to learn, often asking interesting questions that made the sessions interactive. There was a small challenge with language, as some students weren't very fluent in English. To bridge the gap, she explained concepts in a language we both understood, making communication easier.

They also conducted a small test to assess how much they have understood and the kids performed well, showing a good understanding of the concepts, she taught. On the last day, she played with them, and one of the most enjoyable moments was when they imitated their teachers and even me. It was fun to see their perspective and share a few laughs together

Feedback

The teachers and principal at Maulana Azad Model School shared that they were very satisfied with the work done by Geetha, Akshatha, and Navya. They said that all three of us were sincere, responsible, and connected well with the students. We made sure to teach in a way that was simple and easy for the children to understand. They mentioned that the students enjoyed our classes and showed more interest, especially in subjects like English, Maths, and Science.

They appreciated that we patiently explained the concepts, used simple methods, asked the students questions to keep them engaged, and gave special attention to the weaker students too. The teachers and principal felt that we helped improve the students' confidence and made learning more interactive and fun. Overall, they said our efforts had a positive effect on both the students' learning and their interest in studies.

Conclusion



Overall, volunteering at the school was a great experience for all three of us. Teaching and interacting with the students gave us a new perspective on learning and how to make it more engaging. Even with



small challenges like language differences, we found ways to connect and ensure the students understood the lessons. Their enthusiasm and eagerness to learn made the experience even more enjoyable.

Through this experience, we learned the importance of patience, adaptability, and effective communication. We realised that teaching is not just about sharing knowledge but also about making learning enjoyable and accessible for every student. We are truly grateful to the school and our college for providing us with this opportunity, and to the students for their curiosity and energy. It was rewarding to see them participate, ask questions, and even have fun with us. This experience not only helped them learn but also taught them valuable skills.

- Interactive discussion on youth participation in elections.

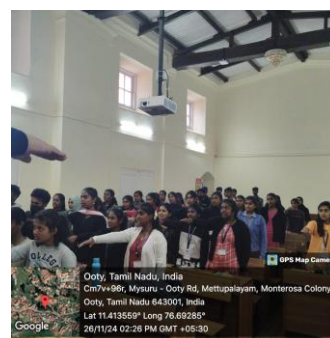

10th to 17th March – 2025

The NSS unit of JSS Medical College, JSS AHER, organised an annual special camp from March 10th to 17th, 2025, at various villages under Devalapura Gramapanchayat (Devalapura, Hadajana, Chikkagowdanahundi, Rayanahundi, Marigowdanahundi, and Ayarahalli). A free health screening and treatment camp was conducted as part of the NSS annual special camp. The camp was organised and supported by JSS Medical College, under the JSS Academy of Higher Education and Research, Mysuru. All our activities are guided, directed, and supported by the principal, Dr H. Basavanagowdappa; the vice-principal, Dr Suma N.M.; Dr Praveen Kulkarni, JSS Medical College, Mysuru; and Mr Satish Chandra, Chief Administrative Officer, JSS Medical College, Mysuru and Dr K L Krishna, NSS Coordinator, JSSAHER, Mysuru.

Mr Chandrakanth N. E., Panchayat Development Officer (PDO), Devalapura Gramapanchayati, Mysuru district, and Dr Bahuguna, Medical Officer, Siddaramanahundi, Mysuru, were instrumental in obtaining permission, planning, and executing the arrangements, as well as providing publicity for the camp and the venue for its conduct. During his inaugural remarks, he reiterated the importance of medical camps, especially in rural areas, and urged the public to make the most of this unique opportunity. The decisions and support of the PDO and Medical Officer were unconditionally supported by PHCOs, Ashaworkers, all members, and other office bearers of the village.

Ms Nishka Gupta, Ms Mouli Mandal, Ms Mridusmita Hazarika, Ms Snigdha Muthyala, and Mr Aniketh (Phase III MBBS) were designated as student coordinators who successfully and systematically organised the camp by joining hands with the NSS officers, doctors, and other students.

The medical health camp team comprised specialists from various departments, including general medicine, obstetrics and gynaecology, and paediatrics, from JSS Hospital and Research Centre, Mysuru, as well as MBBS students from JSS Medical College, Mysuru. There were different counters, like Registration, screening complaints, recording the blood pressure (BP), testing random blood glucose levels (Blood Sugar), checking Height, Weight, and BMI, checking vision with Snellen's and Ishihara charts and one pharmacy counter was set up to dispense free medicine for all the patients who were prescribed medication by the concerned doctors. All these student volunteers provided their services at various medical counters and ultimately delivered the prescribed medications through the pharmacy counter. Around 662 patients, including members of the public and students from schools and Anganwadis, benefited from the services offered during the free medical camp series, which primarily included children, women, and the elderly population. Blood sugar (CBG) levels were tested in 295 patients, and free medications were distributed to 600 patients.

Along with this, the students took the initiative to spread awareness about important issues like nutrition and its values, social hygiene, and personal hygiene.

Right to Education, Child labour, Child marriage, and Beti Bachao Beti Padhao. A small group of students went door to door, covering most of the houses of the village to create awareness and impart knowledge to the families, educating them through posters, flyers, and slogans. Students discussed with the villagers how to break various superstitions and stereotypes. Students divided themselves into two groups to talk to students from both primary and high schools. They visited various classrooms and conducted interactive sessions with the children to enhance their understanding of these topics. The children in the schools were



presented with posters and slogans that allowed them to comprehend the topic at their individual levels. The teachers appreciated the JSS students spreading awareness, as the children can better relate to someone their own age than to an authority figure. The residents of the village and school students were extremely receptive to the information being given to them.

All our activities were supported by the president, vice-president, members and PDO of Devalapura Gramapanchayati. Our activities involved residents. His whole-hearted support by all means stood as a strong base for overall work execution. We are very much thankful for his support and involvement. All these adjuvant services, along with the patient registration counter, were effectively managed by 50 NSS volunteer medical students from Phase II MBBS, in two slots each of 25, who were actively, responsibly, meticulously, and tirelessly involved in assisting these counters for all 7 days throughout the conduct of the camp. Overall, the camp turned out to be a fruitful learning experience for all the volunteers. It helped the medical students contribute their little part towards the objective of "making health care a demand, rather than a need", as rightly said by our respected Vice Principal, Dr. Praveen Kulkarni. NSS Day-Wise Detailed Narrative Report and Action Photos

Day 1:

NSS Annual camp began at Government school Kolipalya Village, Chamarajanagara District on **06/01/2025**. This camp was organised by the NSS unit of JSS Dental College and Hospital under the guidance of the NSS Programme Officer, **Dr. Thippeswamy H.M.** The inauguration was held at the village at around 10:00am. The program was presided by our beloved Principal **Dr. Dhakshaini M.R., Dr. Anushree S.M.**, Administrator, JSS Dental college and Hospital **Mr H.S. Shashikanth (Sri Srinivasan Trust)** and **Gram Panchayat Members. Dr. Thippeswamy H.M.** addressed the villagers to participate actively in large numbers in all camp programs scheduled to be conducted from 06-01-2025 to 11-01-2025. This programme mainly aimed at treating and creating awareness for the tribal people belonging to the **Budakattu Jananga** hailing from **Punajanuru Grama Panchayat**. Dental screening of villagers began and large number of them presented themselves to the camp, total screening 131 and 20 treatments. The treatment procedures were carried out using portable dental unit **Pordadent C-88** which was efficient in carrying out all the treatment procedures for the villagers attending the dental camp.

The session ended with the NSS volunteers giving a oral health care talk to the school children of Government school Kolipalya by creating awareness and teaching the children how to keep up their oral hygiene alongside the complications arising due to not maintaining their oral hygiene.



Day 2:

On the **07/01/2025** the camp was held at Government School in **Rangasandra, Chamarajanagar district**. The screening was done by volunteers of NSS camp in the school and the free dental treatment was given in the school premises using portable dental unit. Total screening 100 and treatment 57 to mention few awareness programmes like to maintain good oral hygiene, proper brushing techniques, harmful effects of tobacco chewing and few volunteers of NSS visited individual houses of the village and distributed pamphlets which clearly gave the information about oral hygiene in the local language. Treatments like GIC restorations, extraction, scaling was done. To receive additional treatments referral cards were given and 69 patients were referred to **JSS Dental College and Hospital, Mysuru** for further treatment. Many people including school children received the treatment in the camp. Free medications and mouth wash were given to the villagers in order to encourage oral hygiene practices among them.



Day 3:

On **08/01/2025**, the NSS Annual Camp was held in **Muneshwara Colony, Chamarajanagar district**. Dental screening and treatment were carried out among villagers and the government school children. Oral hygiene instructions and importance of tobacco cessation was imparted by a few volunteers from JSS Dental College by meeting the villagers individually at their houses with the help of pamphlets. Total screening 57 and 15 treatments for day3. Oral hygiene instructions were given to the school children and were asked individually to demonstrate it among their classmates.



Day 4:

On the **09/01/2025**, the NSS camp was conducted in the **Government school, Bedaguli, Mandya district**. We had full cooperation from people as they were eager to know how the dental check-up and treatment would be; the children of the school were much enthusiastic. The awareness on how the dental disease would lead to systemic illness was given to the people of the village, such as on how diabetes reduces body's resistance to infection, how increased blood sugar level can adversely affect gums and makes it more susceptible to infection. Totally 58 screening and 17 treatments done.

The treatment such as restorations, extraction, and scaling were carried out. The people of the village were happy as they benefitted from the treatment.

**Day 5:**

On **10/01/2025**, the camp took place at **Government School of Rayasandra, Chamaraja Nagara District**. Dental screening and free dental procedures (i.e., scaling, filling, extraction) was given to the villagers of Rangasandra. 222 screening and 88 Treatments done. Oral hygiene Awareness, Environment protection was given to people by visiting every house of the village. Refreshments for all the volunteers were provided by the villagers. It was enriching experience talking to the people and children whose selfless and helpful nature changed our perspectives and made us think about the way of living life.



Day 6:

On **11/01/2025** was the last day of the camp at **Government school, Punajanuru, Chaarajanagara district**. villagers including students at primary school underwent dental screening and free treatment. 19 people were benefited by providing oral prophylaxis treatment and restorations. The entire NSS CAMP was a successful one as people were content and very happy that this free camp was held in their tribal people region and many benefitted with the treatment and even the doctors got more exposure of the current health status and the oral healthcare practices of that particular region by screening more number of people.

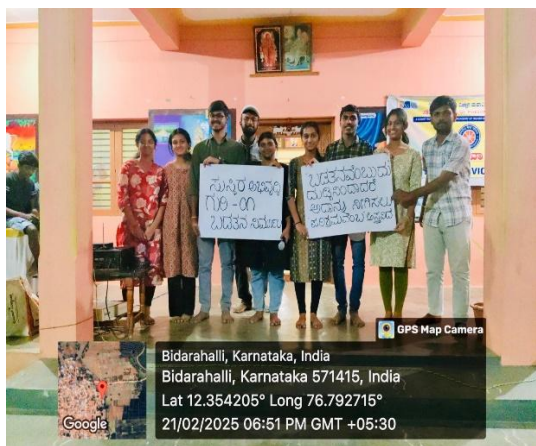

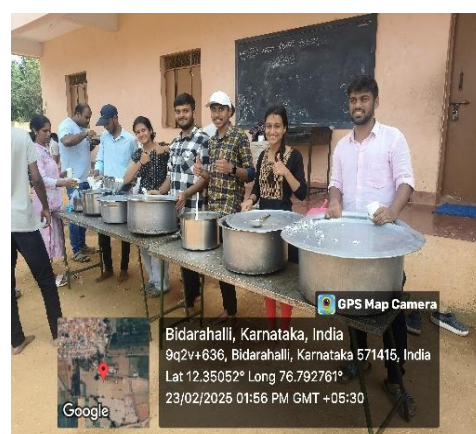

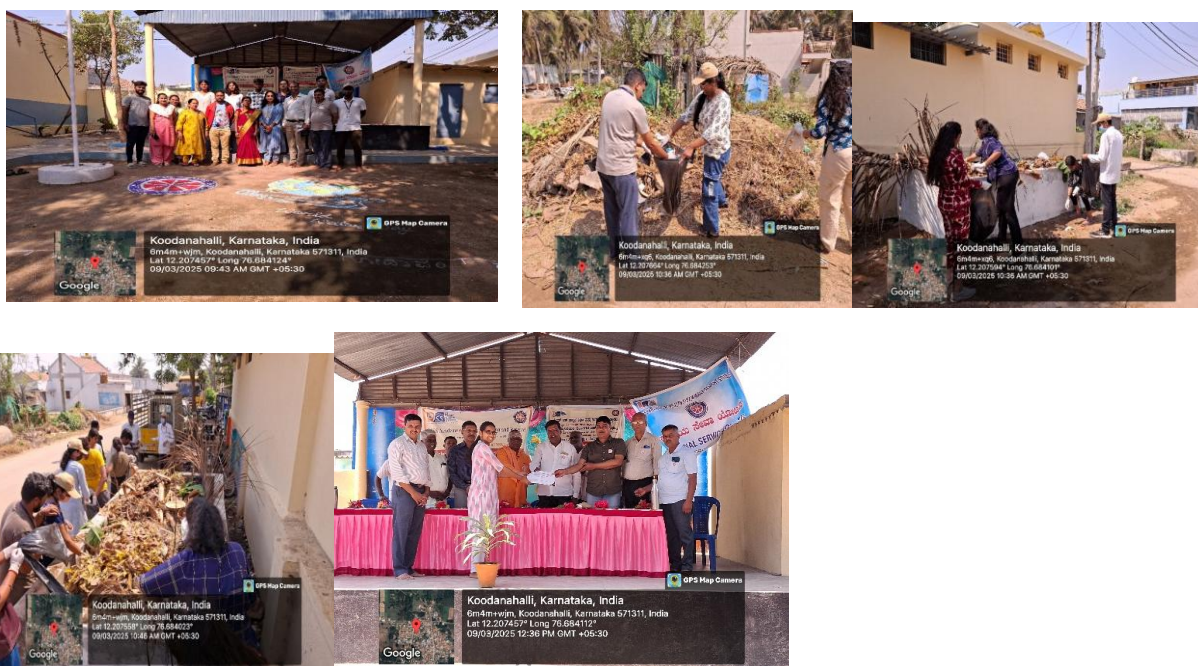
