32.01 Welcome

The Member Secretary submitted his humble pranams to His Holiness Swamiji and requested the Executive Secretary, JSS MVP to chair the meeting. He welcomed all the members present for the meeting.

Pre-Agenda Proceedings

- The officials of JSSMVP and JSSHAER opened the 'AYUSH - Drug Testing Laboratory' approved by the authorities of the State and Union Governments, for the quality testing of Ayurveda, Siddha and Unani products.
- Also, a brochure of the 'AYUSH - Drug Testing Laboratory' was released by the dignitaries.
- An Audio-visual clip about the new 'AYUSH - Drug Testing Laboratory' was launched by the dignitaries.
- Felicitations to the following dignitaries were made
 - Dr. C. G. Betsurmath, Executive Secretary, JSSMVP for having obtained D.Litt. Degree from JSSAHER during the 15th convocation held on 10.1.2025.
 - The newly appointed Vice Chancellor Dr. H Basavanagowdappa
 - The Pro-Chancellor for being the driving force towards all the three cycles of NAAC accreditation and achieved the A++ grade in the third cycle.

- The Scientific Publications of the college for the period of Jan - Dec 2024 compiled in 5 volumes was released by the officials
- DSIR Report on the Technology Readiness Level 6 and above (TRL 6) was released in which about 8 products of JSSCPO have been enlisted for further levels.
- A copy of the book entitled 'Exploring Nanomaterial Synthesis, Characterization, and Applications' edited by Dr R Shanmugam, Assistant Professor & TIFAC Coordinator, JSSCPO was submitted to the board. Dr S P Dhanabal, Dr R Shanmugam, Dr Lalitha Priyanka D authored a couple of chapters in the said book.
- The Principal congratulated JSS AHER for having achieved the prestigious NAAC Accreditation with A++ Grade (CGPA 3.61), a remarkable milestone showcasing excellence in education, research, and institutional growth.
- Also, he congratulated the JSS AHER for its milestone achievement of 500 PhD degrees awarded from its inception to 23.1.2025. He proudly mentioned that JSSCP, Ooty has also attained the milestone of 250 PhD's completed from 1999 to 5.4.2024.

32.02 Confirmation of Minutes of 31st GB meeting held on 16th March 2024

The Member Secretary informed that the Minutes of 31st GB Meeting was communicated to all the members. As there were no remarks/comments from the members, he requested the Chairman and members to confirm the minutes. Thus, the minutes of the 31st GB Meeting were considered and confirmed.

32.03 Report on Action Taken on the minutes of 31st Governing Body Meeting held on 16th March 2024

A report on action taken on the Minutes of the 31st GB meeting was presented before the members.

• 31.04.11

- The Pro- Chancellor has instructed to initiate discussions for fetching a big grant of about 10 - 20 Crores and such project proposal shall be submitted to the appropriate funding agency. By 2025, the project funding should have been obtained, he advised. It can be a collaborative project, but JSSCPO should be the Principal Investigator.

Action Taken: The available opportunities under various funding agencies like DST, DBT, BRNS, BIRAC, ICMR etc. were explored and found no call far towards such big grants.

However, a research project on "Prediction of the risk of morpho-functional imbalance of the visual system by biomarkers of lacrimal fluid in a healthy person in an extreme environment" worth of Rs. 1.5 Cr has been submitted to DST INDO-RUSSIA in Dec 2024. Collaborator: The institute of biomedical problems of the Russian academy of sciences, Russia. Program Coordinator: Dr. K. Gowthamarajan; PI: Dr. KVV Satyanarayana Reddy.

- The Pro-Chancellor informed the Department of Pharmaceutical Chemistry to work

strategically along with other departments and submit a strong DST-FIST application to succeed in the grant this time.

Action Taken: The Department of Pharmaceutical Chemistry re-submitted FIST application for the 1st cycle seeking the support of Rs 1.99 Crores on April 27, 2024.

Also, the Department of Pharmacology submitted the FIST application for the 2nd cycle at level B for a funding support of Rs.3.02 Crores on April 17, 2024.

However, neither of the applications were recommended due to the research profile and publications did not meet the expectations of the agency and inadequate extramural grants.

Dr. SP Dhanabal asked Dr. R Kalirajan, HoD, Department of Pharmaceutical Chemistry, to share his experience. Dr. R Kalirajan said that during the 1st attempt, the application was submitted under the 'Life Sciences' division and then now submitted under the 'Chemical Sciences'. As we are from pharmaceutical chemistry, the committee appreciated all the research work and outcomes of the department but considered the conventional pure chemistry departments for funding.

The Pro-Chancellor informed him to find out the technical issues and address it in consultation with the experts and try to rectify the lacuna in the application to move forward to succeed. We should always learn from others and have continuous dialogues and consultations with experts, he said.

Further, the Pro Chancellor said that as big grant projects cannot be achieved individually, he suggested finding a suitable partner who is capable and who is interested in collaborating. Also, he suggested approaching Dr. Shekar, Vice President, VIT who is looking for collaborators to fetch big project grants from the funding agencies. He will be connected very soon, he said.

Dr. Ponpandian suggested resubmitting the application again to 'Life Sciences' division than Chemical Sciences.

Pro Chancellor further said that there are two things to be understood. One is the academic research requirements for which the areas of computational chemistry, etc., shall be explored. The second aspect should be industrial research requirements viz. synthesis of cost-effective molecules. Strategies to be made accordingly, he advised.

Further, he advised to study ICT, Mumbai in which the faculty are earning lakhs to crore through the consultancy projects to pharmaceutical industries on synthetic chemistry. If needed, Dr Padma Devarajan, the former Dean, Research and Innovation, ICT, Mumbai shall be consulted, and expertise opinion shall be taken.

- 31.06 :
 - Member Secretary requested that, as the institution is showing surplus budget every year, he made a request with the Chairman and leadership to consider for implementing 7th pay scale for the teaching fraternity at the earliest as everyone is contributing their best to the institutional accomplishments.
 - *Action Taken:* Requests have been made once again to the authorities.

- 31.07:
 - The Chairman has advised to include the Smart Campus Initiatives as one of the agenda of the GB meetings in the future.

Action Taken: The information about smart campus initiatives have been included from 32nd GB Agenda notes and presentation.

The Executive Secretary suggested to submit a report on the Smart Campus Initiatives of the college to the District Collector which will be useful to the district administration to include it in the initiatives of the district for Swachh Bharath Survey to Government of India.

- 31.07:
 - The Vice Chancellor has instructed to prepare an elegant brochure depicting the instruments, facilities and research potential of the college which should be only 4 - 6 pages, with colourful photographs and complete but crisp information to attract the industries for consultancy projects.

Action Taken: The draft copy of the pamphlet highlighting the various consultancy services offered by the departments is prepared and is in the final stage.

The Vice Chancellor suggested preparing 2 pages of departmental flyer and 3-4 pages of institutional prospectus.

The Vice Chancellor suggested to encourage the faculty members to become the members of National/International organizations and try to become national / international fellows, as this was pointed out by the Chairman, NAAC Peer Team during the recent audit.

The Member Secretary requested the Chairman and the members to approve the 'Action Taken Report' of the previous meeting and the same was approved.

The Chairman appreciated the member secretary for having taken appropriate actions for most of the suggestions given during the 31st Governing Body meeting.

The Member Secretary presented the 'HIGHLIGHTS' of various events held during the assessment period (1st Jan to 31st Dec 2024).

The Vice Chancellor advised to change the sequence of AAA as Annual Day Celebrations, Awards Alumni Meet & Awards function.

Pro Chancellor advised to use the term Program instead of Course in the admission status.

Also, he has advised to concentrate in the rural segments, especially the Govt. School students to be sensitized for improving the admissions into D.Pharm program. Concession can be given in the fee structure to the rural students joining D.Pharm, he said.

To enhance the number of applications received for various programs, the application fee needs to be revisited and a final decision to be taken on the same, the Pro Chancellor insisted. It was discussed to keep a very small fee like Rs. 100/- for the registration into the admission portal and then during the application to the entrance exam, the actual fee shall be paid by the candidate.

Dr. Ponpandian suggested having an online meeting with the aspiring students who registered in the admission portal to convert those registrations into admissions.

32.04.03 & 33.02.03. Staff Details

Teaching Staff

Details of the existing teaching staff with their qualification, teaching experience, staff resigned/retired and new appointments done, and details of the non-teaching staff were presented.

32.04.04 & 33.02.04. Result Analysis (Academic Year: 2024 - 25)

Subject-wise result analyses of the various courses across all the programs were presented in the meeting.

The Pro-Chancellor advised that all the M.Pharm target to be 'O' or 'A' grade not B grade. So that it will help the students to get a good CGPA and institutional reputation will also be good. This must be addressed in the staff meeting, he advised.

In the case of UG program, in the early semesters like year I, 'B' grade is acceptable but not from year II. All the students' CGPA shall be 9 and above, Pro Chancellor strictly advised.

In practical courses, very critical analysis to be done as in a few subjects in the third year, many students got C grade and got failure grade which are not acceptable, he expressed his concerns.

He wanted to meet the subject in-charge in which the students got failed in practical and also B Pharm VII semester Industrial Pharmacy practical subject teacher in which majority of the students got 'C' grade.

The chairman suggested to have one to one discussion with the respective faculty & students to address the issue of failure in the practical subjects.

Pro Chancellor further suggested that the final year courses must be engaged by the teachers who are very motivational & inspirational, so that the students to be highly performing and making a crucial decision about their career.

32.04.05 & 33.02.05. Library Information Centre

Information about the library books, volumes, facilities available, budget, and utilization data was presented.

Pro chancellor said that in order to 'reimagine the library and its functions on par with the new technological era', an experienced & highly skilled librarian has to be appointed immediately. The proposal in this regard has to be submitted and followed up, he advised. Member secretary requested to appoint a suitable librarian accordingly to take care of day to day activities.

Details of Scientific publications were presented.

Pro Chancellor asked to strategize on how we shall increase the Number of Publications, Quality, and Citations of those publications. He advised to write good quality research papers, decrease the publications in the non-indexed journals.

Dr. Ponpandian said to encourage the staff/students to write good quality research papers more to the Q1 journals and ensure the similarity index to be less than 20%, which should be checked prior to submitting to the journals.

Dr. Ponpandian said that the top 2% of scientists are recognized based on the core area of research, not on the number of publications. Hence, every faculty member should have their core area of research and publications to achieve the top 2% scientist recognition, he said.

The Vice Chancellor has suggested honoring the faculty for their publications. The principal replied that we are following this every year during the AAA function.

Pro Chancellor asked to rearrange the information in the PPT as per the headings, which was accepted by the member secretary.
