ESSENTIAL CLINICAL SKILLS WORKSHOP FOR INTERNS

Two days workshop on Essential clinical skills in two batches was conducted at JSSAHER skill & simulation Centre from 03.04.2023 to 6.04.2023.

173 interns attended the workshop and underwent hands on training in procedural skills.

Hands-on training sessions were conducted on Intravenous line insertion, Ryle's tube insertion, catheterisation, suturing, basic airway management, lumbar puncture, Normal delivery and IUCD insertion.

They also had interactive lecture sessions on ECG interpretation, O2 therapy,

nebulization, IV Fluid, blood transfusion, wound care management, POP application, splinting and hand wash techniques.
