During this foundation course students were addressed about MBBS course, CBME regulations & curriculum, AETCOM modules, electives, compulsory rotatory internship & assessment methods.




Orientation Programme for Interns of 2021-22 Batch on 15-05-2021

any kind of assistance. Dr. H. Basavanagowdappa, Principal, JSS Medical College addressed the


